Entering the competition

Booking onto an event:

- All bookings are made online via the IAPS website.
- Only a member of school staff with a school email address can book onto an event.
- If your chosen location is fully booked, please join the waiting list. Should space become available, we will contact you to offer you the space. There is no guarantee we can find schools an event to attend.

Eligibility:

- All competitors must attend an IAPS School.
- Competitors ages are taken from 1st September.
- Only competitors who are part of the Prep School are eligible to take part.
 Competitors in Year 7 and Year 8 who are part of the Senior School are not eligible to take part in U12 and U13 events.
- Pupils can only participate in one age group throughout the competition.
 The competition is defined as both qualifying events and the finals.
- All schools must bring first aid and additional first aid might be provided.

Event information

- U11 Monday 16 June 2025
- U13 Tuesday 17 June 2025
- Competitors will only be required for the day of their event.

Age groups

- U11 and U13 tournament for both boys and girls
- A team is made up of two players of the same sex
- Schools can enter two teams into each category (age group/gender)
- Teams will be allocated to a pool based on LTA rankings.

Festival format

- The competition will be a round robin format for all categories.
- Each pool will have 3-5 teams allocated, playing a round robin.

Match playing format

- All matches will follow the FAST4 scoring
- Teams will play one rubber per match
- A rubber is made up of 2 singles and 1 doubles E.g player 1 v player
 1(singles 1), player 2 v player 2 (singles 2), school 1 v school 2 (doubles)
- Each match will be played on one court as nominated by the referee, with players rotating on and off after matches as quickly as possible.

Umpiring and scoring

- Players will be expected to score all their matches, as there will be no umpires on court. LTA officials will be acting as court supervisors.
- Less experienced players can have help scoring by an experienced and neutral adult.
- LTA officials will be present to help with any queries or discrepancies
- Matches will not count towards LTA rankings.











Fast4 Tennis

- 1. Matches will be played as the best of two short sets (first to four games) with a tie-break (first to seven points, two points clear at six points all) played at three games all. If at the conclusion of the second set, the score is 1 set all, a match tie-break (first to 10 points, two points clear at nine points all) will be played to determine the outcome of the match.
- 2. All singles and doubles matches will be played using no-ad scoring, with the receiver choosing the side to receive the service from when the game reaches deuce. In doubles the receiving team cannot change positions to receive this deciding point. The player/team who wins the deciding point wins the game.
- 3. Between points, a maximum of 25 seconds is allowed. The maximum time starts from the moment that one point finishes until the first service is struck for the next point.
- 4. When the players change ends at the end of a game, a maximum of 60 seconds are allowed. Players are not permitted to sit down during the change of ends during a set.
- 5. At the end of each set there shall be a set break of a maximum of 90 seconds. Players are permitted to sit down at the end of a set.
- 6. Players are entitled to a 20 minute rest in between matches. The minimum rest periods may be reduced in exceptional circumstances.
- 7. A player shall be scheduled to play up to four FAST4 singles matches in a day.
- 8. REFEREE'S DECISION IS FINAL The referee reserves the right to reduce the scoring format if weather conditions are poor.
