

### Qualification Process

After final group games:

1st and 2nd teams from each pool qualify for Cup Competition.

3rd and 4th placed teams from each pool progress to the Plate Competition.

5th placed teams to play a direct Bowl Final.

We will have a physiotherapist present on the day. However, in the first instance schools are required to administer and provide their own basic first aid. Should it be required, West Mendip Hospital is approx 3.8 miles away (BA6 8JD).

Kindly do not allow pupils to play with hockey balls or undertake activities that may damage the facilities or cause injury. # CODE OF CONDUCT FOR SUPPORTERS

IAPS was founded in 1893 and for over one hundred years we have been committed to supporting Headteachers in their roles as leaders of the top Prep and Independent Junior Schools in the country. Membership of IAPS says a great deal about the quality of the school you send your child to for their education. We provide services to our members offering support and guidance to Headteachers and professional training for staff. We also provide opportunities for children to take part in sport and art competitions. We are not a private company solely engaged in running sports competitions.

The annual sports programme offers a range of team and individual events for children who attend IAPS schools. The children are able to compete in a fun, safe and competitive environment. All organisers and qualified officials are passionate volunteers, who help us to deliver the events in line with National Governing Body rules and regulations.

Where permitted, we are delighted to welcome spectators to attend IAPS events to support the children. IAPS's code of conduct highlights its expectations of spectators, to ensure that all events are enjoyable and fair for the children involved. We hope you support us by reading and applying the following code:

- 1 Be a positive role model and lead by example; children are involved in sport for their enjoyment and without undue spectator pressure.
- 2 Encourage children to play by the rules.
- 3 Respect the officials and their decisions at all times. Video evidence from spectators will not be accepted in any cases to dispute decisions.
- 4 Respect the coaches and their decisions. They give their time, energy and experience to coach your children.
- 5 Refrain from verbal or indeed physical abuse towards players, officials and fellow spectators.
- 6 Be friendly and respectful to the opposition.
- 7 Teach children that effort and teamwork are as important as victory so that the result of each game is accepted without undue disappointment.
- 8 Turn defeat into victory by helping children work towards skill improvement and a positive sporting attitude.
- 9 Be aware that IAPS events have comprehensive safeguarding policies and procedures, available on our website: <https://sport.iaps.uk/safeguarding>
- 10 Relax and enjoy the event.

IAPS wants all of its competitions to run without any negative incidents. Excitement and emotions can run high at events, not least amongst the supporters. Despite this, unpleasant and inappropriate behaviour is very rarely seen but you should be aware that IAPS retains the right to ask you to leave the event, if you fail to comply with the code of conduct.

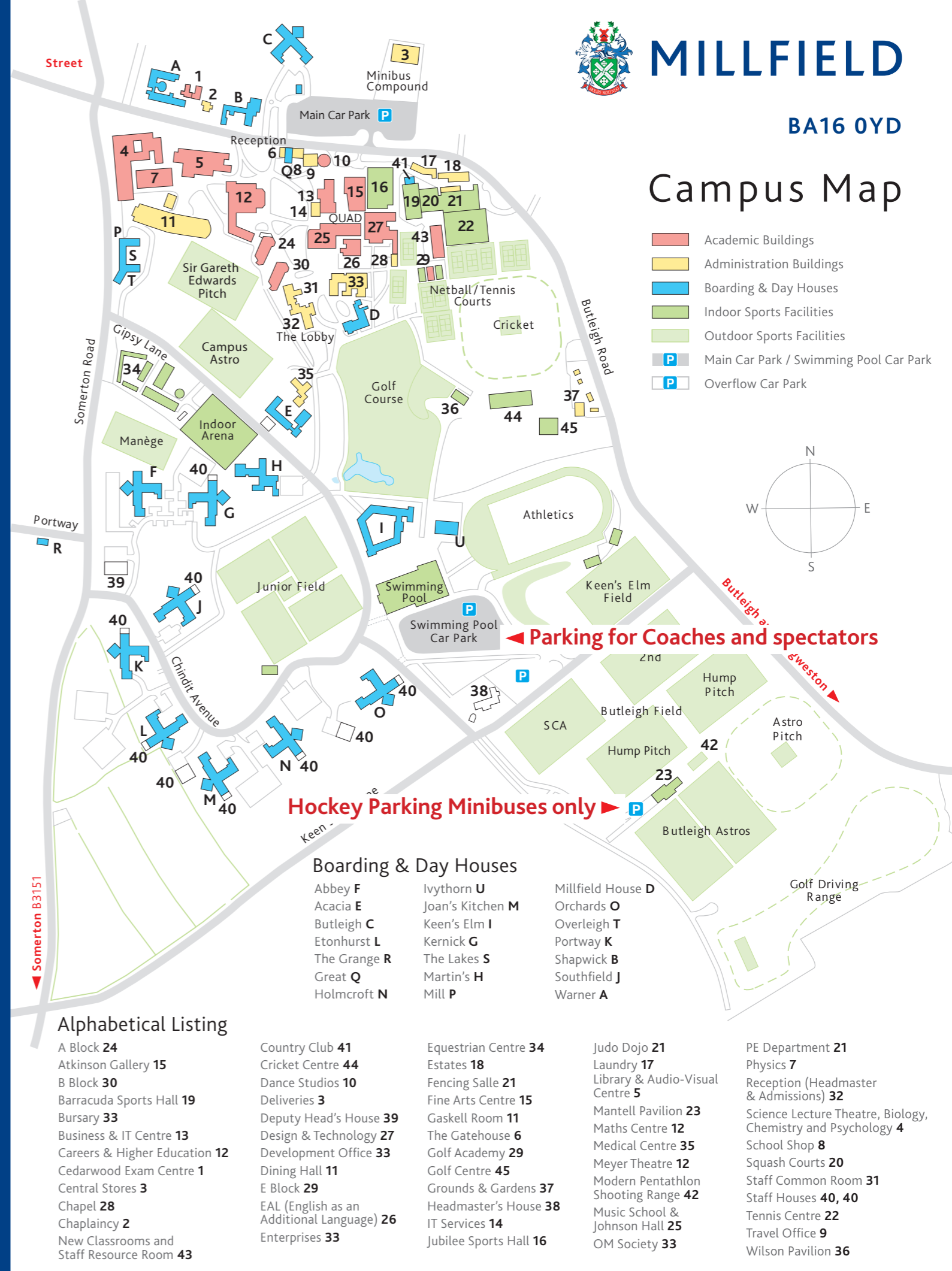

# SAFEGUARDING

# RULES AND REGULATIONS

- Each squad may comprise a maximum of 10 players.
- Pool matches for Group A and D will be 6 minutes each way, Group B and C matches will be 8 minutes each way.
- All Knockout matches will be 6 minutes each way.
- Timing will be controlled by the Umpires after the initial tournament hooter/whistle.
- Additional time will be allowed for serious injury, disciplinary measures and for the completion of a penalty corner or stroke.
- Teams may be penalised for deliberate time wasting.
- Rolling substitutions are allowed at any time, except at short corners, from the half way line.
- Teams arriving late forfeit the game 0 – 2.
- An independent umpire should umpire all matches. (Schools should umpire the match after the match they have just played).
- Each school must provide a competent umpire for the entire day. Umpiring schedules will be supplied, please pay particular attention to the later playoff stages and kindly ensure your umpire is available throughout.

## Pool Stages

The group order will be decided by the number of points scored by each team.

In the event of a tie on points the following will decide final placings.

- 1 Goal difference.
- 2 The team having scored the most number of goals.
- 3 Winner of match between tied teams.
- 4 A series of 3 penalty strokes.
- 5 If still tied then sudden death penalty strokes.

Head-to-head result between two teams is simply the result in the match played between the two tied teams. Sudden-death is started by the team that did not start the penalty-flicks and players may proceed in a different order from the initial best-of-three round.

## Knockout stages

In the event of a draw in the knock out stages the winner will be decided by:

- 1 A period of "Golden Goal" extra time up to a maximum of 5 minutes.
- 2 A series of three penalty strokes by each team.
- 3 If still tied then sudden death penalty strokes.

If three teams are level at the end of a group stage, a mini League with all the results between the three teams is used to decide the final placings.

In the U11 competition, penalty strokes can be taken 5m from the goal line rather than 7m.

# POOL MATCHES

- This qualifier consists of 18 IAPS schools split into four groups.
- Group A and D matches will be 6 minutes each way. Group B and C matches will be 8 minutes each way.
- The 1st and 2nd placed team in each pool will progress to the cup competition.
- The 3rd and 4th placed team in each pool will progress to the plate competition.
- The 5th placed team in each pool will progress to the Bowl Straight Final.
