Ashford School

Competitive fixtures offer pupils the opportunity to represent their School in matches against other local schools, and help to promote excellence for county, regional or even national honours later in their lives. Furthermore, to promote a healthy rivalry between our pupils we also host spirited internal House competitions. In addition to our expert coaches on the staff, we have visits from outside coaches and international sports players to inspire and encourage all our sports teams. Our approach to sport is to be inclusive – for some children sport may not be their most obvious talent. However, the experiences of working as a team, and winning and losing graciously, are relevant for all levels of ability and enthusiasm and can give all children the skills to enable them to participate in and enjoy sport.

Refreshments for spectators will be available in specified areas throughout the day. Lunch will be provided for umpires and teachers from 12:00pm in the pavilion. There will be a water filling station in the pavilion, and we would ask that all rubbish is placed in the bins provided.

Our school fields have little shelter from the weather. Please feel free to bring your own Gazebo to shelter under and sunhats for the children when they are not p[participating.

Match Rules

- There is a maximum of 8 players per team.
- Team who wins toss decides on whether to bat or bowl first.
- Minimum of one neutral umpire will officiate from the bowling end for every match.
- One teacher will umpire and score from square leg when their team is batting for every match.
- One teacher will score from the boundary and supervise the scoreboard when their team is fielding for every match.
- One cricket ball is used per match. Depending on the condition of the ball a new ball may be introduced at the start of a new match.
- Matches are of 5 overs per innings.
- Everyone except the wicketkeeper bowls. Wicketkeepers cannot be changed during the match, unless an injury has occurred. Wicketkeepers must wear full protective equipment.
- Each bowler bowls one 6 ball over.
- Wides and No balls (Foot and Height) count as 3 runs and no extra ball except in the last over of an innings when extra balls will be bowled. The Wides and No Balls will still count as 3 runs in the last over of an innings. Free hits will still apply in the last over too.
- For all No balls (Foot and Height) the next ball will be a Free Hit where the batter can only be out by being run out. If a No Ball is bowled off the last ball of overs 1-4 then the first ball of the next over will be a Free Hit.
- Batsman who score 25 or more must retire but may come back in again at the end for the last wicket.
- When 5 wickets are down the not out batsman continues until he is out. The non-striker will act as a runner.
- In the event of 2 teams gaining equal points at the group stage, the winner will be decided on the total number of runs scored divided by the number of overs faced. If still equal, there will be a penalty "bowl out"; each bowler bowls one ball at an open set of stumps Most hits win!
- In the group stages, please can the side batting second still complete the overs if they pass the total. This means that the boys get a little more cricket and qualification from the group stage could be decided on run rate.





Tournament Format

- There will be three groups of four teams who will all play each other during the group stages. The winner of each group will progress to the semi-finals. The highest 2nd placed team in the group stage based on the number of points will also progress to the semi-finals.
- In the event of a tie for the 2nd placed team the run rate and bowl off rules will apply.
- The winners of the two semi-finals will face each other in the final.
- 3 points for a win / 2 points for a tie / 1 point for a loss.
- 3rd & 4th place play off.
- 3 independent Umpires will carry 2 match balls each & bowler's markers to keep the games flowing.
- Teachers of all schools to assist with square leg umpiring and scoring.
