A very warm welcome to all the pupils, parents, staff and coaches attending today's IAPS U13 netball qualifying tournament.

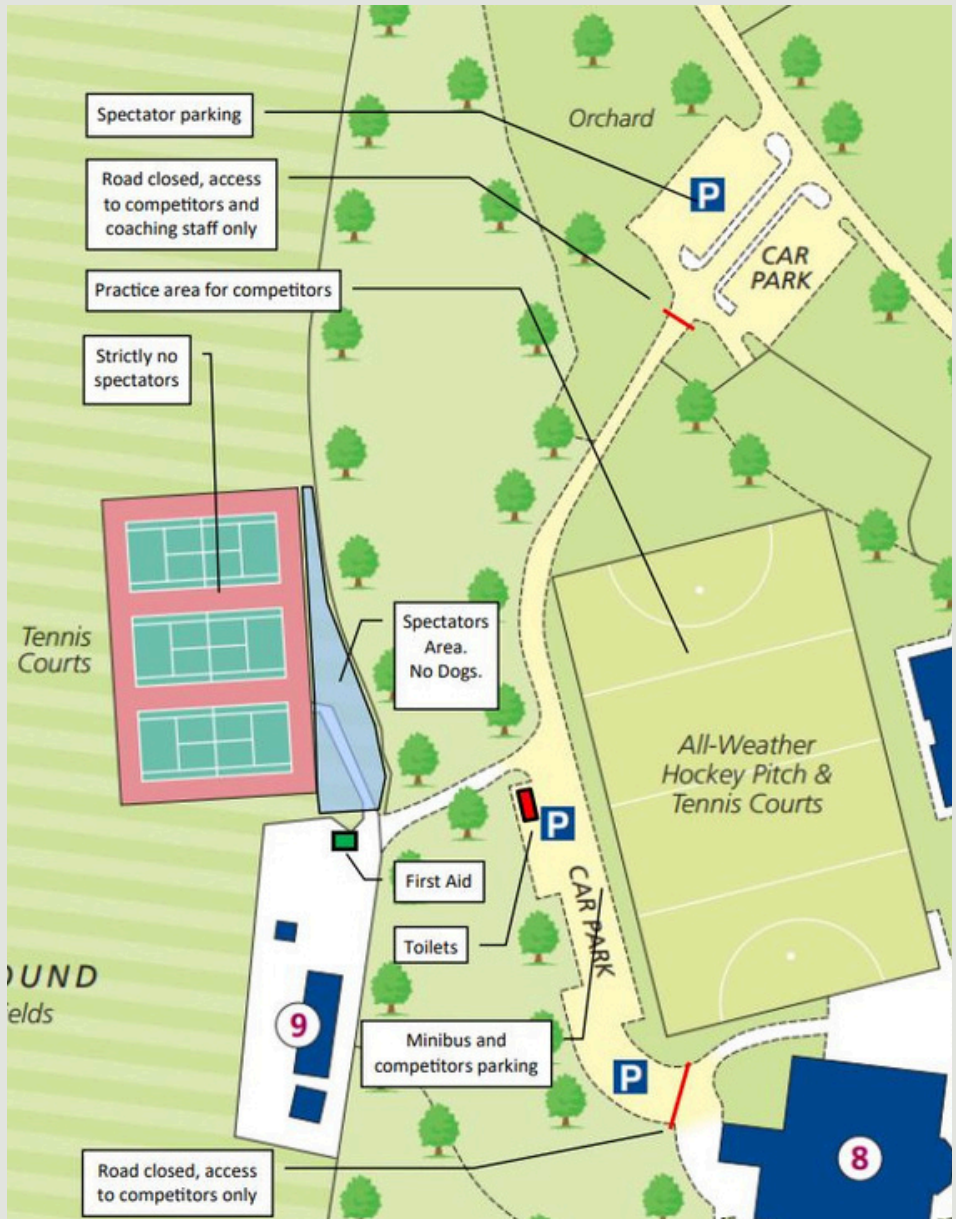
It's wonderful to be able to host an event such as this. We hope everyone has a really memorable day and we look forward to some exciting matches being played.

# Code of Conduct for Spectators

Where permitted, we are delighted to welcome spectators to attend IAPS events. As a spectator/parent at an IAPS sports event, you have a responsibility to:

- Be a positive role model and lead by example. Children are involved in sport for their enjoyment and without undue spectator pressure.
- Encourage children to play by the rules and respect the officials.
- Always respect the officials and their decisions. Video evidence will not be accepted in any cases to dispute decisions.
- Always respect the coaches and their decisions. They give their time, energy and experience to coach the children.
- Refrain from any form of bad language or poor behaviour towards players, officials and fellow spectators.
- Be friendly and respectful to the opposition.
- Teach children that effort and teamwork are as important as victory so that the result of each game is accepted without undue disappointment.
- Turn defeat into victory by helping children work towards skill improvement and a positive sporting attitude.

- Try to relax and enjoy the event!



IAPS wants all competitions to run without any negative incidents. Excitement and emotions can run high at events, not least amongst the supporters. Unpleasant and inappropriate behaviour is very rarely seen but you should be aware that IAPS retains the right to ask you to leave the event if you fail to comply with the code of conduct.

# Safeguarding

IAPS believes that the welfare and wellbeing of all children (young people under the age of 18) and adults at risk attending an IAPS event is of the highest concern. All such persons have the right to safety and protection and any suspicions, concerns or allegations of harm will be taken seriously and will be dealt with swiftly and appropriately.

IAPS expects all adults who are engaged with the delivery of sports events to fully comply with safeguarding procedures as laid out in the IAPS Safeguarding Policy and Procedures, and the KCSiE document (these are available on our website: [sport.iaps.uk/safeguarding](http://sport.iaps.uk/safeguarding)).

IAPS expects all coaches present to be DBS checked and have received relevant safeguarding training at their school/club.

# Event Information

## Tournament Schedule

Please arrive from 0900 for registration, courts will be open for warm up from then. There will be a briefing for coaches and umpires at 0945. First Game will commence at 1000. Please ensure your captains have completed coin toss to decide upon first centre in time for games to all start promptly. We aim to be finished by 1430.

## Umpires

Each school will need to provide their own umpire. It is the responsibility of the school to organise this themselves, if you need help sourcing an umpire please email IAPS. Central timing will be provided. Umpires to bring their own score cards.

## Qualification Process

The 1st and 2nd placed team in each pool will progress to the cup competition. The 3rd and 4th placed team in each pool will progress to the plate competition. The top 2 finishers of the tournament will qualify to the finals.

## First Aid

Schools attending must bring their own first aid kits and medical supplies for pupils in their teams. Port Regis will have medical support on hand in the event of any major issues, shown on the map.

## Changing Facilities

We will not be providing any changing facilities, however there will be temporary toilets located near to the netball courts for the use of players.

## Refreshments

Port Regis will provide soups, rolls and cakes throughout the day for staff and spectators. Schools will need to provide their pupils with packed lunches and snacks. 'Sugar And Slice, And All things Nice' will be on site.



## Parking

Please enter Port Regis School via the North Entrance, directions shown below. Spectators to park in the carpark next to the Orchard and School Mini buses to park in the spaces next to the Astro. Entrance and parking for both school mini buses and spectators are shown on the map on page 2.

## North Entrance Directions from Gillingham

Leave Gillingham and head towards Shaftesbury along the B3081. After crossing the roundabout with Aldi on your left continue for 2 miles and take the first left, signposted Motcombe. After 1 mile the entrance to Port Regis will be on your right. Follow the signs to IAPS parking.

## North Entrance Directions from Shaftesbury

Leave Shaftesbury and head towards Gillingham on the B3081. After crossing under a flyover continue on for 2.8 miles. You will pass an entrance to Port Regis, please ignore this and continue on. Take the first right 1 mile after passing Port Regis, signposted Motcombe. After 1 mile the entrance to Port Regis will be on your right. Follow the signs to IAPS parking.

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## Late Arrivals

Late arrivals may not enter the game whilst play is in progress until allowed by the umpire after a goal has been scored. If any team fails to arrive on time, the match will be void and 5 points awarded to the team present. Umpires must clearly mark the scorecards accordingly. No extra time will be allowed - in the case of an accident/injury, please immediately substitute a player who cannot continue.

# Rules
