WELCOME FROM IAPS

First and foremost, sport is about participation and enjoyment. Sport is an incredibly important part of the personal development of children.

Thanks to our eager and enthusiastic membership, over 22,000 children take part in the IAPS Sport programme every year. With 22 sports to choose from and over 170 events organised annually, there are plenty of opportunities for our member schools to get involved in.

Whether this is your first time at an IAPS event, or you have been entering them for many years, we hope you enjoy the competition and good luck.

INFORMATION & RULES

Format: The tournament will run as follows with four pools of 4 teams

Timings: All matches will be 7 minutes each way with a 1 minute half time (with rolling subs permitted).

There will be 2 minutes between matches. Matches will be centrally timed and there will be no extra time for stoppages. Any serious delay should be reported to the Tournament Referee who will adjudicate.

Pool Stages: 3 points awarded for a win, 1 for a draw, and 0 points for a loss. If at the end of the pool rounds two teams are level it will be decided as follows:

1. Goal difference
2. Goals scored
3. Winner of the match between tied teams
4. Barrage of 3 penalty strokes (3 players selected from the squad)
5. Sudden death penalty strokes**

*Head-to-head result between two teams is the result of the match played between the two tied teams. **Sudden-death is started by the team that did not start the shoot-out and players may proceed in a different order from the initial best-of-three round

Knockout Stages: The top two teams from each pool will qualify for the Cup competition, whilst those teams finishing 3rd and 4th will qualify for the Plate competition

In the event of a draw at full time, the winner will be decided by:

1. A period of "Golden Goal" extra time up to a maximum of 5 minutes
2. Barrage of 3 penalty strokes*
3. Sudden death penalty strokes* *

At U11 competitions, penalty strokes can be taken 5m from the goal line rather than 7m.

Captains: Are responsible for making the toss and ensuring their teams are on the pitch ready for the start of play.

Umpires: An umpiring schedule will be provided and participating schools **must** provide a **competent** umpire. (Please note that In2Hockey rules will be applied).

Teams: Squads can have a maximum of ten players with teams consisting of six outfield players & one fully equipped GK. Bibs will be provided in the event of a colour clash.

Players: Are strongly recommended to wear a GUM GUARD & SHIN PADS

Absolutely no watches or jewellery should be worn; players will be asked to leave the pitch if they are wearing jewellery during play.

Please arrived changed by 09:30 to ensure a prompt start.

Be friendly and respectful to the opposition.

Teach children that effort and teamwork are as important as victory so that the result of each game is accepted without undue disappointment.

Turn defeat into victory by helping children work towards skill improvement and a positive sporting attitude.
