CODE OF CONDUCT FOR SPECTATORS

Where permitted, we are delighted to welcome spectators to attend IAPS events.

As a spectator/parent you have a responsibility to:

- Be a positive role model and lead by example. Children are involved in sport for their enjoyment and without undue spectator pressure.
- Encourage children to play by the rules and respect the officials.
- Always respect the officials and their decisions. Video evidence will not be accepted in any cases to dispute decisions.
- Always respect the coaches and their decisions. They give their time, energy and experience to coach the children.
- Refrain from any form of bad language or poor behaviour towards players, officials and fellow spectators.
- Be friendly and respectful to the opposition.
- Teach children that effort and teamwork are as important as victory so that the result of each game is accepted without undue disappointment.
- Turn defeat into victory by helping children work towards skill improvement and a positive sporting attitude.

IAPS wants all competitions to run without any negative incidents. Excitement and emotions can run high at events, not least amongst the supporters. Unpleasant and inappropriate behaviour is very rarely seen but you should be aware that IAPS retains the right to ask you to leave the event if you fail to comply with the code of conduct.



SAFEGUARDING

IAPS believes that the welfare and well-being of all children (young people under the age of 18) and adults at risk attending an IAPS event is of the highest concern. All such persons have the right to safety and protection and any suspicions, concerns or allegations of harm will be taken seriously and will be dealt with swiftly and appropriately.

Refreshments will be available at the pavilion for parents and staff. Staff will be given a box of refreshments which they can distribute to their team at any point in the afternoon.







RULES AND REGULATIONS

- 1. Squads: Teams of 7 to be chosen from a squad of no more than 10 players.
- 2. Laws: There will be no offside. Goalkeepers may not punt or drop kick the ball; they may throw or roll the ball or kick the ball, once they have released it into play. Goal kicks can be taken from anywhere inside the penalty area. At restarts players must be at least 5 yards from the ball. Normal Laws of the Game apply in all other areas.
- 3. Duration: All matches will be 8 minutes long with no half time break.
- **4. Substitutes:** Rolling substitutions may be made for any reason at any time on notification to the referee.
- **5. Size of ball:** A size 4 ball will be used in all matches.
- **6. Colours:** In the event of a colour clash, the first named team will be required to change their shirts. (We will provide a set of bibs for each pitch on the day)
- 7. Tournament Organisation: Group matches will be played on a league basis. Positions will be determined by the following order of preference: a) By the team scoring the most points. (3 for a win, 1 for a draw) b) By the team with the best goal difference. c) By the team scoring the most goals. d) By the result of the match between the two teams. e) By the taking of penalty kicks (3 players selected from the squad) f) 3 kicks per team then sudden death
- **8. Qualification for the Knockout Stages:** The top four sides in each pool will progress into the Quarter-finals of the Cup Competition. The 5th and 6th placed teams in each pool will progress into the semi-finals of the Plate competition. 7th placed teams will compete in the bowl final.
- 9. Knockout Matches: If matches are level at full time at this stage of the competition, 3 minutes each way "Golden Goal" extra time will be played. If still inconclusive there will be a penalty kick shoot-out (3 kicks per team then sudden death).
- 10. The **1**st **& 2**nd placed teams from the cup competition will qualify for the national finals.







POOLS / ORDER OF PLAY

- This qualifier consists of 2 pools of 7 teams.
- Matches will be 8 minutes one way.
- The 1st 4th placed team in each pool will progress to the cup competition.
- The 5th 6th placed team in each pool will progress to the plate competition.
- The 7th placed team in each pool will progress to the bowl competition.
