## CODE OF CONDUCT FOR SPECTATORS

Where permitted, we are delighted to welcome spectators to attend IAPS events.

As a **spectator/parent** at an IAPS sports event, you have a responsibility to:

1. Be a positive role model and lead by example. Children are involved in sport for their enjoyment and without undue spectator pressure.
2. Encourage children to play by the rules and respect the officials and their decisions
3. **Respect the officials and their decisions at all times. Video evidence from spectators will not be accepted in any cases to dispute decisions.**  
Respect the coaches and their decisions, they give their time, energy and experience to coach your children.
4. **Refrain from any form of abuse towards players, officials and fellow spectators.**
5. Be friendly and respectful to the opposition.  
Teach children that effort and teamwork are as important as victory so that the result of each game is accepted without undue disappointment.
6. Turn defeat into victory by helping children work towards skill improvement and a positive sporting attitude.
7. Be aware that IAPS events have comprehensive safeguarding policies and procedures, available on our website:

Relax and enjoy the event.

IAPS wants all competitions to run without any negative incidents. Excitement and emotions can run high at events, not least amongst the supporters. Unpleasant and inappropriate behaviour is very rarely seen but you should be aware that **IAPS retains the right to ask you to leave the event, if you fail to comply with the code of conduct.**

### Refreshments

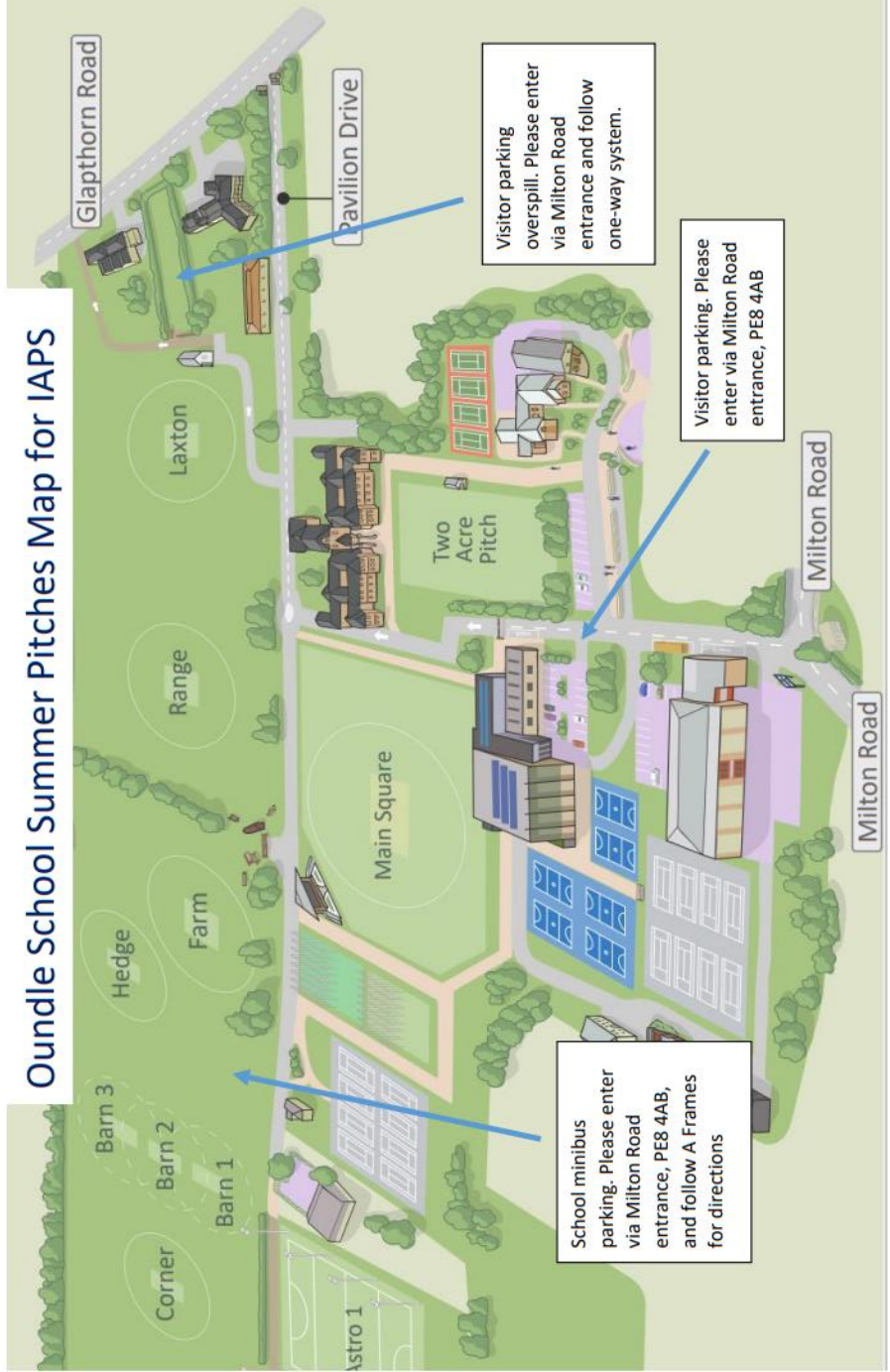

## FORMAT

Each team will play all 3 teams within their pool in the morning.

2 points for a win, 1 for a tie. At the end of the pool stages, the teams will be ranked 1<sup>st</sup> to 4<sup>th</sup> with those rankings making the new pools for the afternoon matches where there will be a semi final and then final & 3<sup>rd</sup>/4<sup>th</sup> play off (P.O). We will now not try and fit a 6<sup>th</sup> fixture in due to some school's time limitations.

In the event of equal points, then it will be total wickets taken that decides the order.

In the event the total number of wickets is equal, it will be total runs scored.

## RULES AND REGULATIONS

- Teams consist of 8 players. Squads of up to 10 players allowed;
- 7 x six ball overs per innings (aiming for 25 mins per innings) all bowled from the same end;
- 7 players must bowl 1 over each per game, with the wicket keeper being the designated non bowler;
- Batting will be 'out you out';
- Wides shall count as 2 runs with no extra ball, until the last over where it will be re-bowled;
- No balls shall count as 1 run with an extra ball which will be a free hit;
- No balls for front foot overstepping, deliveries over waist height and if the ball bounces more than twice;
- Batters shall retire at 25 but may come back in once all others have batted;



- 3 fielders must stay within the 'invisible' fielding circle (within roughly 30 yards).
