Ashford School

Sport commands an important place within our school life for all children.

Ashford Prep School offers a wide range of games to suit most tastes, and these are available from an early age as part of our formal curriculum. Physical Education and Games begin in Nursery with ball skills and swimming. From there on, the Prep School children start competing against local Prep and Primary Schools. Competitive fixtures offer pupils the opportunity to represent their School in matches against other local schools, and help to promote excellence for county, regional or even national honours later in their lives. Furthermore, to promote a healthy rivalry between our pupils we also host spirited internal House competitions. In addition to our expert coaches on the staff, we have visits from outside coaches and international sports players to inspire and encourage all our sports teams. Our approach to sport is to be inclusive – for some children sport may not be their most obvious talent. However, the experiences of working as a team, and winning and losing graciously, are relevant for all levels of ability and enthusiasm and can give all children the skills to enable them to participate in and enjoy sport.

Match Rules

- Teams will consist of up to 10 players maximum. 8 players on pitch at a time.
- Please bring enough equipment for the next pair to be padded up ready to go in (4sets of pads and gloves)
- Matches are pairs cricket- Played with a hardball.
- Each fielder, bowls one (over-arm) 6 ball over.
- Wides and No balls count as 2 runs. There will be no extra balls played in the final over during the qualifying rounds.
- A wicket lost is -5 runs.
- The team scoring the most runs will be the winners.
- A neutral umpire will be provided to officiate from the Bowler's End. One coach from each team will officiate and keep score at Square Leg; ensuring scores are agreed at the end of each over.
- 45 minutes has been allocated for each match so please complete matches as soon as possible.
- Captains should toss to decide who is first to field prior to each match.
- Matches will be scored: 3 points for a win. 1 point for a tie (Equal runs, wickets lost not included) 0 points for a loss.
- The top 8 teams at the end of the qualifying rounds will continue into the finals to play in the Cup or Plate competition.
- The winners of each group will continue into the finals of the Cup. Plus, the highest scoring runner-up from all 3 groups 4 teams in total.
- The remaining 3 group runners up, plus the highest run scoring team will enter the Plate Competition.
- In the finals extra balls will be played in the final over.
- In the event of a tie the winner will be decided on the total number of runs scored divided by the wickets lost. If still equal, there will be a penalty 'bowl out;' each bowler bowls one ball at an open set of stumps; most hits win.





Tournament Format

- There will be three groups of four teams who will all play each other during the group stages. The winner of each group will progress to the semi-finals. The highest 2nd placed team in the group stage based on the number of points will also progress to the semi-finals.
- In the event of a tie for the 2nd placed team the run rate and bowl off rules will apply.
- The winners of the two semi-finals will face each other in the final.
- 3 points for a win / 2 points for a tie / 1 point for a loss.
- 3rd & 4th place play off.
- 3 independent Umpires will carry 2 match balls each & bowler's markers to keep the games flowing.
- Teachers of all schools to assist with square leg umpiring and scoring.
