Cricket pitches

Eastbourne College will be holding all matches for this tournament on College Field, Eastbourne College, BN2 I 4JY. Please see our website for further details.

RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR THE TOURNAMENTS

The aim of the tournament is to give as much cricket exposure to the girls during the day with every school playing five matches.

- 1. Eight a-side teams with 10 max, to be brought in the squad if desired.
- 2. Pitches will be 17 yards for U11 games and 19 yards for U13 games
- 3. Soft ball cricket with approx. 35 yard boundaries
- 4. Eight over matches with pairs batting (two overs each)
- 5. Minimum of five bowlers, not everyone has to bowl, but max. two overs per bowler
- 6. Wides
 - a. First wide / no ball = one run, extra ball
 - b. No Ball = Free hit
 - c. Every wide after that = two runs, no extra ball
- 7. Round robin tournament to be played
 - a. Three points for a win, zero for a loss
 - b. A tied match will result in a super over
- 8. In the event of a equal total points the winner will be based on:
 - a. The result between the two teams
- 9. Schools to umpire matches and keep score
- 10. Mobile score boards will be pitch-side to use

WET WEATHER

In the event of bad weather forecasted, teams will be notified by 8.00am on Monday 10 June and Wednesday 12 June if the tournament will have to be cancelled.
