

P13: RS: developing a creative and inspiring RE curriculum at KS1/2

This session will explore a range of practical classroom strategies that exemplify a rich KS1-2 curriculum. Using case studies from Christians, Muslims, Hindus and non-religious worldviews, delegates will have an opportunity to see how to enrich and extend their current curriculum. We will address some of the significant issues in RE, including ways of helping pupils to learn lots and remember more, how to use different disciplines and methods to examine ideas, what worldviews mean in RE and how to teach about worldviews.

Stephen Pett, National Association of Teachers of RE Trainer, will share lots of resources to help delegates consider their own practice by using new ideas to try out for themselves. The session will be interactive, including an opportunity for delegates to talk in small groups about their curriculum and how the session's ideas might support its development.
