CODE OF CONDUCT FOR SPECTATORS

Where permitted, we are delighted to welcome spectators to attend IAPS events.

As a **spectator/parent** at an IAPS sports event, you have a responsibility to:

- 1. Be a positive role model and lead by example. Children are involved in sport for their enjoyment and without undue spectator pressure.
- 2. Encourage children to play by the rules and respect the officials.
- 3. Always respect the officials and their decisions. Video evidence will not be accepted in any cases to dispute decisions.
- 4. Always respect the coaches and their decisions. They give their time, energy and experience to coach the children.
- 5. Refrain from any form of bad language or poor behaviour towards players, officials and fellow spectators.
- 6. Be friendly and respectful to the opposition.
- 7. Teach children that effort and teamwork are as important as victory so that the result of each game is accepted without undue disappointment.
- 8. Turn defeat into victory by helping children work towards skill improvement and a positive sporting attitude.

- 10. Try to relax and enjoy the event!

IAPS wants all competitions to run without any negative incidents. Excitement and emotions can run high at events, not least amongst the supporters. Unpleasant and inappropriate behaviour is very rarely seen but you should be aware that IAPS retains the right to ask you to leave the event if you fail to comply with the code of conduct.

EVENT INFORMATION

Parking

Parking for minibuses and spectators will be in School House Yard or Sedgwick House Yard on Busk Lane. There will be signs on the day directing visitors to these parking areas, but both are just a short walk from the Hirst Centre which is also situated on Busk Lane.

Late arrivals

The tournament schedule cannot allow for late arrivals. Any schools arriving late will forego points for that game and points will be awarded to the opposing team.

Tournament schedule

Teams should arrive from **12.00pm noon** at the Hirst Centre, Busk Lane, Sedbergh. Map coordinates: 54.320006022828245, -2.5309420590715. What3words: glows.relax.hinders

Team managers should meet at **12.30pm** for a short briefing.

The tournament will start at 12.40pm and finish at 4.45pm

Umpires

Each team should bring a confident and competent umpire. Teams will use their own umpire to officiate their matches.

Qualification process

The tournament will be run as a round robin. The winning school (of the round

robin) will qualify for National Finals to be held at Cranleigh Prep on Monday 17th March 2025.

There will be no final or semi-final as such.

The tournament will be played under England Netball Rules.



First aid

Medical cover will be provided by Sedbergh School, but schools are asked to bring their own First Aid kit for minor injuries or ailments.

Changing facilities

Separate facilities are available for competitors and adults / spectators on the ground floor of the Hirst Centre.

Refreshments

Schools will be expected to bring their own packed lunches, but tea/ coffee and snacks will be available for spectators throughout the tournament. Packed teas will also be provided for teams on departure.

MERCHANDISE

IAPS are delighted to have Team Elite as our official merchandisers, to sell branded products both online and at events throughout the year. All commission made from merchandise is directly put back into running the sports programme. Merchandise can be bought online or at several IAPS sport events.

RESULTS

Results for team events will be published live using SOCS. Results for individual sports events will not be available live but will be published on our website as soon as possible after the event.

Please note all results are now published in the member area of our website which is only accessible to school staff. Parents should request any information from the school.

PHOTOGRAPHY ADVICE

There is no professional photography at IAPS Sport events, however parents and spectators can take their own pictures. There is no law against taking photos at public events for personal use, including pictures of other people's children (<u>Ask the Police, 2018</u>). RULES AND REGULATIONS

Matches will be centrally timed and will be 7 minutes each way, with 2 minutes between each and 4 minutes between games.

Matches will be umpired by each school, but all schools have undertaken to provide or employ a confident and competent umpire to ensure fair and highquality umpiring throughout the tournament.

Teams should toss and decide first centre pass prior to the start of play.

All teams should provide a change of bibs in case of a clash.

The winner, progressing through to the next round will be determined purely from the round robin. There will be no finals.

SCORING

- 5 points win
- 3 points draw
- 1 point for scoring 50% or more of the winning team's score

TIES

The group order will be decided by the number of points scored by each team. In the event of a tie on points the following will decide final placings:

- Goal difference
- Total goals scored
- Result between the two teams



The following rules have been introduced to ensure the

tournaments remain smooth with minimum delay.

1. Request for Tactical Change

Each team can request one tactical change per game from the umpire.

2. Types of Tactical Changes

Tactical changes can include: Swapping an on-court player with a substitute player. Changing players' playing positions.

3. Procedure for Requesting Tactical Changes

Teachers/coaches are situated on the goal line near their defence at the start of play.

This positioning allows the teacher/coach to communicate with their GK/GS and ask them to inform the umpire about the desired tactical change.

The umpire must be informed of any request for tactical changes before the C-Pass.

Changes can only be made before a C-Pass.

Changes must be quick. Please ensure any substitutions have their bibs on ready to take the court

4. Umpire's Guidance and oversight

An umpire can refuse a tactical change if: The changes are considered frivolous.

The request is made at a time that would disrupt or delay play.
