In this course, the issues surrounding EDI in school sport are identified with practical strategies to build EDI into the PE curriculum and promote diversity and inclusivity within the PE curriculum. This includes covering how to create a culture of respect, understanding and acceptance where all pupils feel valued and helping delegates to ensure that schools are engaging in EDI through school sport in an impactful way.
