

IAPS Sailing Championships

Sailing takes place in the Summer term.

Information about Sailing 2026 will be released in the Autumn term.

Entering the competition

Booking onto an event:

- All bookings are made online via the IAPS website.
- Only a member of school staff with a school email address can book onto an event.
- If the event is fully booked, please join the waiting list. Should space become available, we will contact you to offer you the space. There is no guarantee we can find schools a space to attend.

Eligibility:

- All competitors must attend an IAPS School.
- Competitors ages are taken from 1st September.
- Only competitors who are part of the Prep School are eligible to take part.
 Competitors in Year 7 and Year 8 who are part of the Senior School are not eligible to take part in the U13 event.
- Pupils can only participate in one age group throughout the competition.
 The competition is defined as both qualifying events and the finals.
- All schools must bring first aid and additional first aid might be provided.

Event information IAPS Sailing Championships

The Andrew Simpson Sailing Centre, Weymouth, is responsible for the organisation and delivery of the IAPS Sailing Championships. Once entries have been collected by IAPS, all information is passed to the centre who will liaise directly with schools.

Age groups and entries

- U11 competition Wednesday 21st May 2025
- U13 competition Thursday 22nd May 2025
- Sailors must have a minimum of RYA Stage 2.

Each school is limited to two boats per age group with two sailors in each boat per day (eight pupils in total).

Cost of entry

- £160 per boat (2 children per boat).

Race format

- Four races are scheduled daily (weather dependent).
- Details of the race course will be released roughly two weeks prior to the event.

Boat hire

- There are 36 Zest's available for each age group.
- The Zest is a versatile dinghy for beginners through to stage 4 sailors. It has
 an adaptable mast which allows for a jib and the children will doublehand the
 dinghy. For more information about this dinghy, visit the RS website here.
