

IAPS Golf Championships

Golf takes place in the Summer term.

Information about Golf 2026 will be released in the Autumn term.

Entering the competition

Booking onto an event:

- All bookings are made online via the IAPS website.
- Only a member of school staff with a school email address can book onto an event.
- If the event is fully booked, please join the waiting list. Should space become available, we will contact you to offer you the space. There is no guarantee we can find schools a space to attend.

Eligibility:

- All competitors must attend an IAPS School.
- Competitors ages are taken from 1st September.
- Unless otherwise specified, schools can only enter one team per tournament/championships.
- Only competitors who are part of the Prep School are eligible to take part.
 Competitors in Year 7 and Year 8 who are part of the Senior School are not eligible to take part in U12 and U13 events.
- Pupils can only participate in one age group throughout the competition.
 The competition is defined as both qualifying events and the finals.
- All schools must bring first aid and additional first aid might be provided.

Championship for APS Golf Championships Event information

Age groups

- This competition is for both individual and/or team entries.
- A team is made up of 3 players per age group.
- Schools can enter only 1 team per age group.
- Pupils will go out in groups of 3.

Level of golfer

- Competitors must be competent golfers and not total beginners.
- The event is not handicapped, but we ask you to provide children's handicaps (if they have one) on the booking form to make the scheduling of tee times easier.

Practice round

- Competitors can play a practice round the day before the competition or anytime in the lead up to the competition.
- Please contact <u>Tom Sheffield</u> directly at the golf club to book your practice round.
- The competition will take place on the Avening Course.

Tees

Red tees will be used for the whole competition

Dress code

 There is a relaxed dress code in the clubhouse. No golf shoes or hats are to be worn inside. On course, normal golf attire is required, especially golf shoes. No football/rugby shirts are permitted.

Scoring system

- The scores for all 18 holes will be calculated on a modified Stableford system. A par will be worth 3 points, a birdie 4 points, A bogey 2 points and a Double bogey (2 over par) 1 point – this has been done to reduce complications with handicap. Players will be required to pick their ball up once they are unable to score on each hole to keep the pace of play.

Markers

- Schools must provide one marker per team, this must be a member of school staff and not a parent/quardian.
- If schools are invited to enter more than one team, an additional marker will need to be provided by the school.
- If schools are unable to provide a marker for their team, they risk being withdrawn from the competition.

Late arrivals

 If a competitor is late for the registration/tee time, they may forfeit their place in the competition. We cannot guarantee a later tee time.

First aid

 Schools are to bring their own first aid kit. There will be first aiders on site from the golf club as well to support if necessary.

Wet weather protocol

 We hope that this will not be required, however if there is a particularly poor forecast, the event organisers will make a decision on any cancellation 24 hours prior to the scheduled start. In all other cases, we will endeavour to complete the tournament.

Equipment

Competitors to bring own clubs and balls to use on the day

Other facilities available

When competitors are not taking part in the competition, they can use the chipping green, driving range and golf nets at the club.

Accommodation

There is no accommodation available on site.
