Swimming championships Information guide 2024/2025



Each year around 4600 competitors compete in over 30 qualifiers for a place at the national swimming finals. 1500 children qualify for the national finals.

Able-bodied competition

• Para competitor entry is separate to the team entry and must be booked under a separate ticket.

Entry conditions

Able-bodied competition

- Competitors can enter 1 individual race and 2 relays.
- Schools can enter the following, per age group:
 - One different competitor per stroke (breaststroke, backstroke, butterfly or freestyle).
 - Two relay races (medley, freestyle <u>or</u> both). Additional swimmers can be brought in to make up the relays only.

Example 1: Swimmer 1 = breaststroke Swimmer 2 = backstroke Swimmer 3 = butterfly Swimmer 4 = freestyle

Swimmers 1-4 = medley, freestyle <u>or</u> both relays.

Example 2: Swimmer 1 = breaststroke Swimmer 2 = backstroke Swimmer 3 = butterfly Swimmer 4 = freestyle

Swimmers 1-12 = medley, freestyle <u>or</u> both relays (combination of 4 swimmers per relay)

Para athlete competition

- Competitors can enter 1 individual race.
- Schools can enter more than one swimmer.
- Schools will self-classify the swimmer using the tool kit found on our website, this information will then be sent to <u>sport@iaps.uk</u>.

Competitor & school eligibility

- Competitors ages must be taken from 1 September
- All competitors must attend an IAPS school
- o Schools must use Swim Manager to submit their competitor details
- Schools who do not submit competitor details using Swim Manager may be asked to withdraw from the championships.

Rules & regulations

- The national governing body for swimming in England is Swim England.
- All IAPS swimming qualifiers are conducted under the <u>Swim England regulations and technical rules</u>
- All races are swam using a 25m pool.
- Competitors may swim up an age group but must <u>only</u> compete in that age group for the duration of the competition.
- We **do not** accept PB's recorded outside of an official IAPS qualifier. All swimmers must take part in a qualifier for their time to count.
- Diving can only take place at one end of the pool, even if the venue has two deep ends. A lot of schools only have one deep end, therefore this rule helps keep the competition as fair as possible.
- Winning the race does not guarantee a place at the finals, it is a time trial and results are submitted nationally.
- The referee's decision is final.
- Video evidence will not be accepted in any cases to dispute decisions.

Qualifying for the finals

Able-bodied competition

- Qualification for the finals is achieved based on the time swam at a qualifier.
- It is the school's responsibility to check whether swimmers have qualified for the finals once results are announced.
- Qualifying numbers are:
 - o Individual races top 20 swimmers in each age group
 - Relays top 20 schools in each age group
 - Small schools relay top 10 schools across all the qualifiers

Para athlete competition

o Subject to entry numbers, all para competitors will be invited to IAPS swimming championships.

Booking onto a qualifier

- All bookings are made via the IAPS website
- Only a member of school staff with a school email address can make the booking.
- You must select all the age groups you wish to enter
- You will receive two confirmation emails once you have booked on. If you do not receive any emails (don't forget to check your junk folder), please check your booking went through.

Submitting your competitor details

- Schools must use Swim Manager to submit their competitors' details.
- All Swim Manager links are provided later, including instructions on how to use the software.
- Make sure you submit your competitors' details at **least 2 weeks before** the qualifier.
- The organising school may ask for them earlier, please respect their request and submit your details on time.
