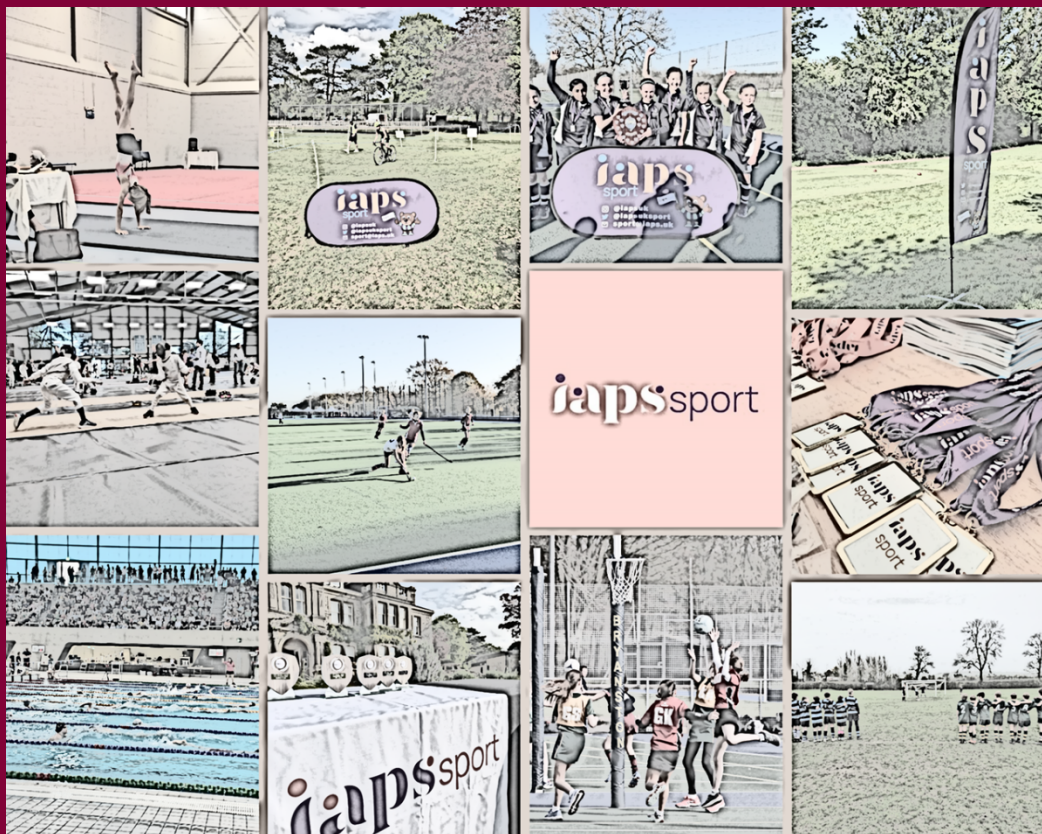

# WELCOME FROM SCHOOL



9 November 2023

Please find enclosed the programme for the IAPS Girls' U13 Hockey Final to be held on the Haileybury All Weather Surfaces on Friday 17th November 2023. I hope that the directions enclosed will help those who are making the journey for the first time. **Please arrive by 9.00am** for the formal briefing (at 9.15am) and registration.

The format of the Finals is a cup, plate and bowl competition after the pool stage. The number of sides entering means that each team will get a minimum of 6 games of hockey and if successful 8 games.

There is a maximum of 10 girls per squad. This will mean that there will be a lot of children and hopefully supporting parents around. Please make sure that valuables are kept safe as we cannot be held responsible for any missing items. Please ensure staff take responsibility for their squads and prevent children warming up/down on the muddy grass pitches nearby.

Please be aware that although we are hoping to be able to have neutral umpires on duty all day, there may be the requirement to ask some of you to umpire. Also please bring a small medical kit for any minor injuries that your players may sustain. A change of colour or a set of bibs may also be necessary as well as a match ball.

Each team will have access to a changing facility, although this will inevitably be shared with other teams. Therefore one would be best advised to arrive in kit. One half of the indoor sports hall is available with tables to set as a team base, as well as access to the other half for warm up or practice.

As per previous years, we are aiming to invite all students, coaches and spectators into our dining hall for lunch. Please still order your own school packed lunches in case there is a last minute change of plan.

# CODE OF CONDUCT FOR SPECTATORS

Where permitted, we are delighted to welcome spectators to attend IAPS events.

As a **spectator/parent** at an IAPS sports event, you have a responsibility to:

As a **spectator/parent** you have a responsibility to:

1. Be a positive role model and lead by example. Children are involved in sport for their enjoyment and without undue spectator pressure.
2. Encourage children to play by the rules and respect the officials.
3. Always respect the officials and their decisions. Video evidence will not be accepted in any cases to dispute decisions.
4. Always respect the coaches and their decisions. They give their time, energy and experience to coach the children.
5. Refrain from any form of bad language or poor behaviour towards players, officials and fellow spectators.
6. Be friendly and respectful to the opposition.
7. Teach children that effort and teamwork are as important as victory so that the result of each game is accepted without undue disappointment.
8. Turn defeat into victory by helping children work towards skill improvement and a positive sporting attitude.

10. Try to relax and enjoy the event!

IAPS wants all competitions to run without any negative incidents. Excitement and emotions can run high at events, not least amongst the supporters. Unpleasant and inappropriate behaviour is very rarely seen but you should be aware that **IAPS retains the right to ask you to leave the event if you fail to comply with the code of conduct.**

# SAFEGUARDING



IAPS believes that the welfare and wellbeing of all children (young people under the age of 18) and adults at risk attending an IAPS event is of the highest concern. All such persons have the right to safety and protection and any suspicions, concerns or allegations of harm will be taken seriously and will be dealt with swiftly and appropriately.

## Qualification process

1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> in each group go into the Cup. 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> go into the Plate. 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> go into the Bowl.

Changing rooms will be provided. Toilets for students in outside changings near rackets court. Staff and parents toilets in the sports hall.

## RULES AND REGULATIONS

**Briefing in Sports Hall at 9.15am**

### SCORING

- 3 points for a win
- 1 point for a draw
- 0 points for a loss

### LATE FOR MATCHES

Automatic 3-0 loss

### RULES IN CASE OF A TIE:

#### POOL STAGE

The group order will be decided by the number of points scored by each team. In the event of a tie on points, the following will decide final placing's:

1. Goal difference
2. Goals scored
3. Winner of match between the tied teams\*
4. Barrage of 3 penalty strokes
5. Sudden death penalty strokes\*\*

\*Head-to-head result between two teams is the result of the match played between the two tied teams.

\*\*Sudden-death is started by the team that did not start the shoot-out and players may proceed in a different order from the initial best-of-three round.

#### KNOCKOUT STAGE

In the event of a draw in the knockout matches, the winner will be decided by:

1. A period of "Golden Goal" extra time up to a maximum of 5 minutes
2. Barrage of 3 penalty strokes
3. Sudden death penalty strokes
