Sport plays a pivotal role in Haileybury life. It allows every pupil to develop their confidence and character through physical, technical and mental stimulus, as well as through teamwork and leadership opportunities.

Our 'sport for all' ethos means that we want all our pupils to enjoy sport regardless of experience or ability. We regularly have **20 teams for each of our core sports:** hockey, rugby, netball and cricket with well over **1,000 fixtures a year** across more than 25 different sports in total.

Festival format

- Ten players max per squad (U11 on 1/09/2023). Eight in a team.
- The first round of matches will begin at 10.00am. Match Briefing at 9.30am
- Two groups of five teams, moving into seeding match ups
- All matches (including finals) will be 55 minutes max, with 8 overs to be bowled within 25 minutes, and a 5 minute turn around between innings.
- We will bowl from one end to speed the matches up
- Three points awarded for a win, one each for a tie and zero for a loss.

Rules

The 'normal' Laws of Cricket will apply throughout.

Weather

In the event of weather conditions limiting play, matches will be resolved with a bowl off (net run rate will be excluded):

- Five different bowlers, bowling at three stumps on a spare track.
- The most hits of the stumps wins (one ball each, and it must pitch before the popping crease to count).
- A (foot) no ball, renders that delivery void.
 In the event of it being a draw after five rounds, then it will go to sudden death, with the same bowlers being available again.

Arrival

Teams are asked to arrive and register at the Pavilion by 9.30 am in order to attend the briefing.

Umpires

We would hope to be able to have neutral umpires throughout the day, however the respective coaches should please be prepared to be asked to umpire should the need arise.

Match Tea

- All teams are required to bring their own lunches.
- Tea, coffee and cakes will be available from the silver catering cart situated by the Pavilion.



Regulations

1. Matches

Each game shall be played between two teams of eight players. A match consists of a maximum of 8 six ball overs bowled by each side. A team shall not be permitted to declare its innings closed. Each game consists of only one innings per team. Batters will bat in pairs, with each pair facing two overs. Each member of the fielding team must bowl a minimum of one over each apart from a designated keeper. One member of the fielding side can bowl two (2) overs.

2. Length of innings

The maximum time allowed for the length of an innings shall be 25 minutes, with a five-minute turnaround between innings and between matches.

3. Number of players per team

Only eight players are permitted to play in each game. The eight players nominated to play in the game must be written on the score sheet before the commencement of the game.

4. Bowling

Each member of the fielding team shall bowl one over each with exception of the wicketkeeper. One member of the fielding side can bowl two (2) overs. Bowling will occur from one end to speed up the match time.

The wicketkeeper must be nominated before the start of the match, and under no circumstances shall the wicketkeeper be allowed to bowl. During play the wicketkeeper must stand in a normal wicket keeping position at the instant of delivery otherwise a no-ball shall be called.

A different wicketkeeper may be nominated for each game but cannot be changed during the course of the game.

An over must consist of six balls, except in the final over of the innings where there must be six legal balls completed.

5. Extras

A wide shall be counted as two extras to the batting team and with no extra ball apart from the final over where there must be six legal deliveries except in the final over of the innings.

A no-ball shall count as two extras to the batting team and an extra ball shall be bowled. Any runs scored from a no-ball (off the bat, byes, or leg byes) will be credited in addition to the extras for the no-ball.

Any ball, which after bouncing, passes the batsman above the shoulder height in their normal batting stance or would have passed them above waist height without bouncing shall be called a no-ball.

Any ball, which after bouncing, passes the batsman above the waist height in their normal batting stance or would have passed them above waist height if it strikes the batsman's body or bat shall be called a no-ball.

6. Batting

Teams will start their innings on 200 runs.

If a batter is out they will swap ends with their partner and lose 5 runs for each wicket that falls.

If the batsman becomes ill or injured during the course of the game, a runner will be permitted, subject to the umpires' approval. The runner shall be a member of the batting team and where possible will have already batted. The replacement must come from the nominated eight players for that particular game.

7. Fielding restrictions

No fielder is permitted within a 10-metre radius of the batter, excluding the arc from wicketkeeper to point.

The umpire shall have the final say on all fielding restriction decisions. In the event of an infringement, the square leg umpire shall call and signal no-ball. If a fielder becomes injured or ill during the course of the game, a substitute fielder will be permitted, subject to the umpire's approval. The substitute fielder will not be able to bat or bowl.

8. Match results

A game shall be won by the team having the highest completed score at the end of the game. The game concludes when the target is reached, or when the nominated number of overs is completed, or when the team batting second is completed within the nominated number of overs.

Any match or qualification complaint shall be referred to the Match Referee (Haileybury Director of Cricket) who will make a determination.

Three points awarded for a win and one each for a tie. If teams are equal on points at the end of the pool stages, the winner of the previous encounter between the two teams will progress. If this match was tied then the team with the highest average run rate per ball will progress. If this is still undecided then the least wickets lost followed by most wickets taken will be considered. If teams still cannot be separated then a bowl out will be performed. If more than one team are level on points at the end of the group stages then the highest average run rate per ball will be used.

In the case of a tied match in the seeding match ups the winner will be determined by a bowl off. Each team will get five deliveries to hit three stumps. Each of the five outfield players will have one delivery each and the team that hits the stumps most times will progress. If the bowl off is all square after five deliveries it will go into sudden death bowl off.

9. Spirit of cricket

The MCC's Spirit of Cricket should upheld throughout the festival. The Match Referee (Haileybury Director of Cricket) must be contacted immediately if any situation arises in which the Spirit of Cricket has not been upheld.

Please use the toilets in the Sports Complex and at the back of LAMDA on Bradby Lane.


Refreshments


