Eligibility

- 1. All competitors must attend an IAPS School.
- 2. Competitors ages is taken from 1st September.
- 3. Competitors can only participate in one age group throughout the competition. The competition is defined as both qualifying events and the finals.
- 4. Unless otherwise specified, schools can only enter one team per tournament/championships.
- 5. Only competitors who are part of the Prep School are eligible to take part.

 Competitors in Year 7 and Year 8 who are part of the Senior School are not eligible to take part in U12 and U13 events.
- 6. All schools must bring first aid.





Event information

Age groups

U9, U10, U11, U12 & U13

Championship tournament

- The Championship tournament is suited to experienced players aged U11-U13.
- This tournament will be played over seven rounds across two days.
- The time control will be 45 minutes per player.
- Games in all these sections will be ECF graded.
- There will be medals for each competition and the team event. The top four players from each school counting towards the team results.

U9 and U10 tournament

- The U9 and U10 sections will have their own age tournament on day one and will then be divided up into A, B and C sections for day two, based on their day one performance.
- On day one competitors will play four rounds (1 hour per round).
- On day two competitors will play five rounds (1 hour per round).

U11-U13 tournament

- The U11/U12/U13 section is for players who are not experienced enough to play in the Championship section.
- This tournament will be played over seven rounds across two days.
- The time control will be 45 minutes per player.
- Games in all these sections will be ECF graded.
