CODE OF CONDUCT FOR SPECTATORS

Where permitted, we are delighted to welcome spectators to attend IAPS events.

As a spectator/parent you have a responsibility to:

- I. Be a positive role model and lead by example. Children are involved in sport for their enjoyment and without undue spectator pressure.
- 2. Encourage children to play by the rules and respect the officials.
- 3. Always respect the officials and their decisions. Video evidence will not be accepted in any cases to dispute decisions.
- 4. Always respect the coaches and their decisions. They give their time, energy and experience to coach the children.
- 5. Refrain from any form of bad language or poor behaviour towards players, officials and fellow spectators.
- 6. Be friendly and respectful to the opposition.
- 7. Teach children that effort and teamwork are as important as victory so that the result of each game is accepted without undue disappointment.
- 8. Turn defeat into victory by helping children work towards skill improvement and a positive sporting attitude.

- 10. Try to relax and enjoy the event!

IAPS wants all competitions to run without any negative incidents. Excitement and emotions can run high at events, not least amongst the supporters. Unpleasant and inappropriate behaviour is very rarely seen but you should be aware that IAPS retains the right to ask you to leave the event if you fail to comply with the code of conduct.





SAFEGUARDING

IAPS believes that the welfare and wellbeing of all children (young people under the age of 18) and adults at risk attending an IAPS event is of the highest concern. All such persons have the right to safety and protection and any suspicions, concerns or allegations of harm will be taken seriously and will be dealt with swiftly and appropriately.

Hockey Pitches

Eastbourne College hockey pitches are located at Beresford and Summerdown (see map for location and postcodes)

Changing Facilities and Toilets

Beresford is the main College hockey site where changing rooms can be used, refreshments served and toilets can be found. Summerdown is a short walk (250m) up the road from Beresford.

There is parking on Compton Drive outside the astro, but on the astro side of the road only. Minibuses parked on Compton Drive in particular must be parked on the astro side of the road. We will ask spectators to do the same and not park on both sides in order to look after our neighbours and residents on Compton Drive. Our thanks for passing this on to any spectators attending the tournament.

Hospitality

There will be some refreshments and hospitality available for players, officials and supports at the Beresford Pavilion.



PLAYING REGULATIONS

IAPS Rules and Regulations

IN2Hockey Rules

All IAPS hockey tournaments are conducted under the In2Hockey rules, including their ruling on gender splits within tournaments according to their most up-to-date regulations. All documents are available on the IAPS Sport website.

Pool Matches

- This qualifier will consist of four pools of four teams.
- Matches will be seven minutes each way with one minute half time.
- The Ist and 2nd placed team in each pool will progress to the cup competition.
- The 3rd and 4th placed team in each pool will progress to the plate competition.
- Pool one and two will play on Beresford Astro.
- Pool three and four will play on Summerdown Astro.
- Cup knockout rounds will be played on Beresford.
- Plate knockout rounds will be played on Summerdown.

Scoring

- Three points for a win
- One point for a draw
- Zero points for a loss

Ties

If on completion of a pool leading teams are equal on points, their positions will be determined as follows:

- I. Goal difference.
- 2. Goals scored.
- 3. Winner of match between the tied teams.
- 4. Barrage of three penalty strokes.
- 5. Sudden death penalty strokes.
