RULES OF PLAY

Matches will take place concurrently on three different cricket pitches. Match balls will be provided by Canford School, but this year we would ask staff to officiate/score their own matches, in order to allow appropriate match management and player development. Feel free to bring two members of staff.

School teams to consist of eight players per side.

The duration of the first innings will be a strict 30 minutes (timed by umpires). Shortly before the 30 minute time limit, the umpires will indicate 'last over'.

The duration of the second innings will directly reflect the first, in terms of number of overs completed in the first innings.

Individual bowlers are limited to two overs per innings.

Batsmen will retire when reaching a personal score of 30 runs.

Two runs will be awarded for all wides and no-balls, and there will be no extra delivery in that over. In the final over of the innings, there WILL be an extra delivery for each wide or no-ball bowled. The batting position of each player must move at least two places from match to match.

These playing conditions are somewhat different to standard conditions used, but they are designed to offer the best chance to maintain accurate timings throughout the day as far as possible; this is particularly important because the distance between some pitches may have an impact on the start and finish times for each match.

We have set a first innings duration of 30 minutes, but if it is clear that we have to recover lost time later in the festival in order to end at the appropriate time, then we may opt to reduce this first innings time limit. In any one match, both teams will always face a similar number of overs.

We will ask you to drive your minibus between most venues to save time and walking with equipment.
