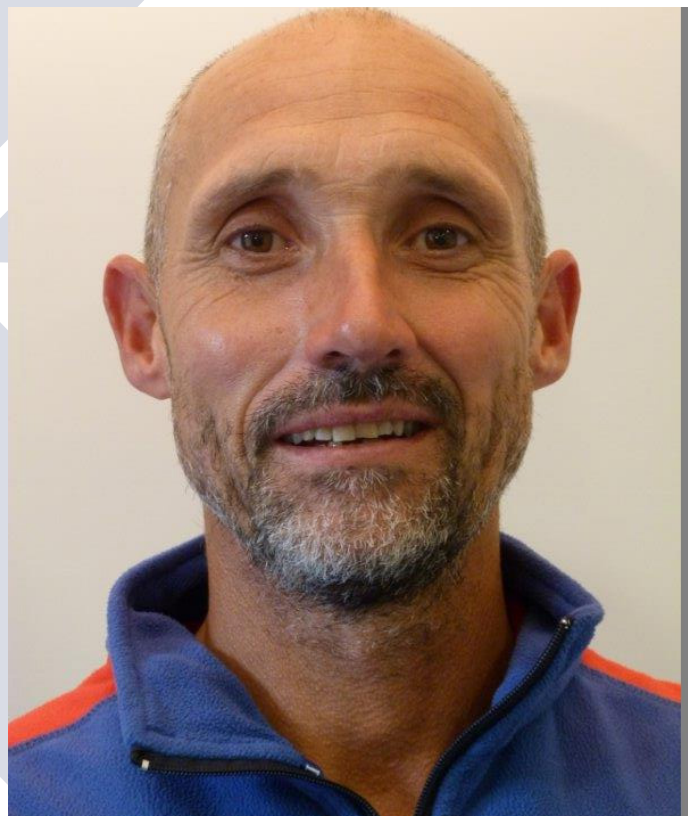


I would like to extend a warm welcome to everyone. I hope the players will have a great day, make new friends and gain valuable experiences that will help in their cricket development.

EVENT INFORMATION

Parking

Can all minibuses and spectators park at the bottom car park, please use the 'overflow car park' if this is full. Any coaches will need to drop off and leave the campus to return for collection.

Umpires

Each team will need to bring a competent umpire. There will be four external umpires on the day to umpire of round robin competition. Schools are required to keep scores. Please sit together to confirm scoring throughout the match.

First aid

Schools will be responsible for their own first aid on the day.

Changing facilities

Please come changed, ready to play, toilets will be allocated on the day. Make a base in the sunshine at your pitch.

Refreshments

Tea, coffee and biscuits will be provided throughout the day for staff and spectators. Players, parents and staff will be given a barbecue lunch, but schools may wish to bring further snacks for the day.

Late arrivals

Teams arriving late will deem to have lost the match and opponents gain 3pts for a win.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

Aim

1. The enjoyment for, and fair play by, all players.
 - 1.1. No coaching from coaches/sideline. Allow players to decide and make choices on the pitch

Pitch

2. Two sets of wickets, 17 yards apart.
 - 2.1 Boundaries – maximum of 40 metres apart but can be reduced to accommodate more matches — most are 35m.

Teams

3. Each team comprises of eight players. Squads are limited to ten players.
 - 3.1 In the event of injury to a player, a substitute will be allowed to field, but not bowl. Should such an injury prevent the player batting, a substitute will be allowed to bat only with the permission of the opposing member of staff.

The Start

4. The two teams toss a coin to decide which team has the choice of either batting or fielding first.

The Game

5. Throughout the tournament each game shall consist of one innings per team, each innings to be eight overs long.

Batting and Scoring

6. The batting side shall be divided into pairs, each pair batting for two overs, with a new pair starting at the end of the second, fourth and sixth overs.
 - 6.1 Each team starts batting with a score of 200 runs.
 - 6.2 Each time a batter is out, five runs are deducted and the other batter of the pair faces the next ball.
 - 6.3 A batter may be out bowled, caught, run out, stumped, hit wicket.
Please shout the scores out after EACH over, to ensure scores are the same at the end.
 - 6.5 Runs will be scored in the normal way.

6.6 Two runs will be awarded to the batting team for each wide ball and no-ball bowled. If a bats person hits a wide, this is deemed as a good ball. Scoring will count in the usual way.

6.7 At the end of the first two overs, the first pair of batters retires and is replaced by the second pair until all 4 pairs have batted for two overs each.

6.8 The second team then bats for their eight overs.

6.9 NO L.B.W's, unless the batter deliberately blocks the ball with a leg or foot

Bowling and Fielding

7. Each player on the fielding side must bowl one over. NO L B W's.

7.1 Bowling will take place from one end only.

7.2 Bowling should be over arm. Under arm is Unacceptable.

7.2.2.No Ball - Where the ball bounces more than twice before reaching the batter or arrives with the batter at shoulder height, or above, without bouncing, 2 runs will be rewarded

We will be playing rule 7.2.2 in the Tournament.

7.3 Players on the fielding side DO need to rotate fielding positions.

7.3.2. Only four players on the boundary at any time maximum

7.4 With the exception of the wicketkeeper no fielder may field within ten metres of the wicket, measured from the middle stump except behind the wicket on the off-side. A fielder may move into the restricted area to field a ball provided he/she was outside the area when the stroke was made.

7.5 Byes and leg byes – if a batter misses the ball, or if it hits their body, they may still run and score byes.

7.6 No extra ball will be allocated for wides or no-balls, except in the last over of each innings when, in addition to the two runs, an extra ball will be bowled.

- Matches are permitted to be 1 hour and 15 minutes.

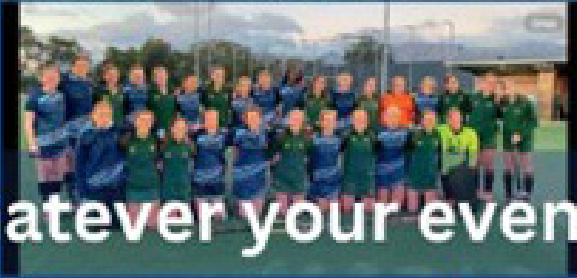

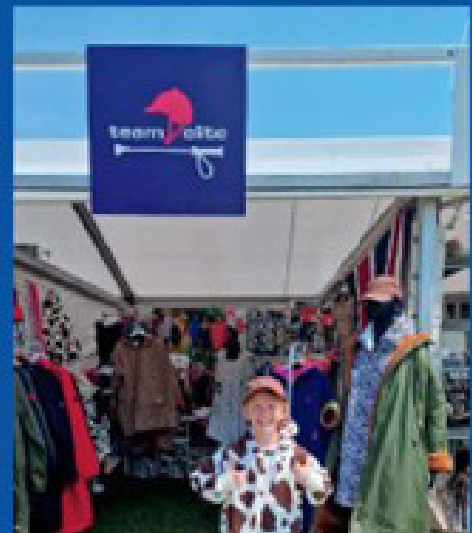
