Brighton College have had a proud history in Sport. Sixteen Rugby teams are regularly fielded each Saturday instilling a love of the game to continue playing after they leave Brighton College whether this be at University or within Club Rugby at all levels.

Coaching philosophy of the Club: 'Using Rugby to make every individual as good as they can be both on and off the field to enable them to fulfil their potential in life' More recently over 30+ players have gained junior international caps and signed professional contracts in the last 10 years including the Chisholm brothers and Marcus Smith who recently won the Premiership with at Harlequins. Three Brighton College boys were signed by Harlequins last season (2022) which makes it currently six in the Harlequins senior squad.

The most recent Full England cap is Marcus Smith who also became the first Old Brightonian to play for the British and Irish Lions.

We help all of our boys to gain places at good Universities where they can continue their academic and sporting endeavours.

The school were proud to host Japan in their build up to the historic victory over South Africa in the last Rugby World Cup and Brighton College is also currently a training base for Harlequins, Australia and England Rugby teams.

Brighton College was named 'School of the Decade' by The Sunday Times based on brilliant academic and sporting performances in recent years.

# CODE OF CONDUCT FOR SPECTATORS

Where permitted, we are delighted to welcome spectators to attend IAPS events.

As a **spectator/parent** at an IAPS sports event, you have a responsibility to:

1. Be a positive role model and lead by example. Children are involved in sport for their enjoyment and without undue spectator pressure.
2. Encourage children to play by the rules and respect the officials.
3. Always respect the officials and their decisions. Video evidence will not be accepted in any cases to dispute decisions.
4. Always respect the coaches and their decisions. They give their time, energy and experience to coach the children.
5. Refrain from any form of bad language or poor behaviour towards players, officials and fellow spectators.
6. Be friendly and respectful to the opposition.
7. Teach children that effort and teamwork are as important as victory so that the result of each game is accepted without undue disappointment.
8. Turn defeat into victory by helping children work towards skill improvement and a positive sporting attitude.

10. Try to relax and enjoy the event!

IAPS wants all competitions to run without any negative incidents. Excitement and emotions can run high at events, not least amongst the supporters. Unpleasant and inappropriate behaviour is very rarely seen but you should be aware that **IAPS retains the right to ask you to leave the event if you fail to comply with the code of conduct.**

# SAFEGUARDING

IAPS believes that the welfare and wellbeing of all children (young people under the age of 18) and adults at risk attending an IAPS event is of the highest concern. All such persons have the right to safety and protection and any suspicions, concerns or allegations of harm will be taken seriously and will be dealt with swiftly and appropriately.

# EVENT INFORMATION

## Parking

School minibuses can park on-site at The Jubilee Sports Ground, BN2 5UA.

Due to very limited car parking spaces at the Jubilee Ground, all spectators will be asked to park within the neighbouring East Brighton Park car park or along Sheepcote Lane outside the front of the entrance to the Jubilee Sports Ground.

## Late arrivals

Registration will open for teams at 11.30am. All fixtures are due to start promptly at 12.00pm. Fixtures are expected to start promptly according to the schedule.

## Tournament schedule

All schools should aim to arrive no later than 20 minutes before their first fixture to register. All group fixtures will take place on the lower rugby fields. Waterfall fixtures will take place across three pitches

## Referees

Brighton College (Senior School) will provide referees for the group stages. Neutral referees will referee the waterfall fixtures following the final group matches.

## Qualification process

Group stages will lead to a waterfall round of fixtures (1st vs 1st etc.)

## First aid

Medical staff will be on-site at the Jubilee; however, all schools are encouraged to bring their own medical bag to attend to any minor injuries.

## Changing facilities

Only school participants will have access to changing facilities within the Jubilee Sports Ground pavilion. School staff will have limited access to a separate staff changing room should they need to use this facility.

## Refreshments

Hot match teas will be provided for all school staff and participants. This will be available throughout the afternoon inside the Jubilee Pavilion. Spectators can help themselves to tea, coffee and spectator's teas within the Jubilee Pavilion.

## MERCHANDISE

IAPS are delighted to have Team Elite as our official merchandisers, to sell branded products both online and at events throughout the year. # RULES AND REGULATIONS

- No results will be published by the organisers or IAPS on the day or post-event.

- 6 players in a fully contested scrum (all players must be confident and competent)
- No limit on numbers contesting for the ball including in the maul and ruck
- Sin Bin: 5 minutes
- Match Duration: 6 minutes each way

### Sports Scholarships

Each year, we offer scholarships to pupils demonstrating outstanding ability in their chosen field. For Sport, we offer scholarships 11+ and 13+ admission.

Sports Scholarships are offered to candidates who demonstrate outstanding sporting ability and potential for future development.

#### 11+ Sports Scholarships:

As part of the **11+ Junior Scholarship**, suitable for pupils who are strong academically, we assess sporting performance if this is selected as an area of strength to support academic achievement.

#### 13+ Sports Scholarships:

Brighton College offers a wide variety of sports for girls and boys. When considering

applications for the **13+ Sport Scholarship**, an assessment is carried out across each of our core sports; rugby, football and cricket for boys, and netball, hockey and cricket for girls. However, consideration is also given to applicants offering other sports, in particular athletics, swimming and tennis.

Application for the **13+ Sport Scholarship** assessment is open to candidates currently in Year 8. The invitational **13+ Sammy Woods Specialist Sports Scholarship** offers an opportunity for pupils to demonstrate outstanding sporting ability and excellence in their specialist sport.
