CODE OF CONDUCT FOR SPECTATORS

Where permitted, we are delighted to welcome spectators to attend IAPS events.

As a spectator/parent you have a responsibility to:

- Be a positive role model and lead by example. Children are involved in sport for their enjoyment and without undue spectator pressure.
- Encourage children to play by the rules and respect the officials.
- Always respect the officials and their decisions. Video evidence will not be accepted in any cases to dispute decisions.
- Always respect the coaches and their decisions. They give their time, energy and experience to coach the children.
- Refrain from any form of bad language or poor behaviour towards players, officials and fellow spectators.
- Be friendly and respectful to the opposition.
- Teach children that effort and teamwork are as important as victory so that the result of each game is accepted without undue disappointment.
- Turn defeat into victory by helping children work towards skill improvement and a positive sporting attitude.

- Try to relax and enjoy the event!

IAPS wants all competitions to run without any negative incidents. Excitement and emotions can run high at events, not least amongst the supporters. Unpleasant and inappropriate behaviour is very rarely seen but you should be aware that IAPS retains the right to ask you to leave the event if you fail to comply with the code of conduct.

SAFEGUARDING

IAPS believes that the welfare and wellbeing of all children (young people under the age of 18) and adults at risk attending an IAPS event is of the highest concern. All such persons have the right to safety and protection and any suspicions, concerns or allegations of harm will be taken seriously and will be dealt with swiftly and appropriately.

IAPS expects all adults who are engaged with the delivery of sports events to fully comply with safeguarding procedures as laid out in the IAPS Safeguarding Policy and Procedures, and the KCSiE document. These are available on our [website](#).

EVENT INFORMATION

● Parking

You are welcome on site from 9.15am, please follow signs for minibus parking and head to the 'sign in' section outside the front of the sports hall. Each team will have a section of the sports hall to use as their 'dry base' for the day, though please note food and drink should not be consumed in the sports hall.

● Late arrivals

If you are late and won't make your first game, please call 07770 876070 as soon as possible. The first missed game can be played during the lunch break, any subsequent games will be forfeited, and the opposition will claim a 5-0 win.

● Tournament schedule

Please see the tournament schedule later in this document. If a team pulls out, they shall be replaced where possible with a direct team name switch.

● Umpires

Each school should provide a confident and competent umpire on the day. The umpire shall not officiate your own matches and will be needed to stay for the duration of the competition.

● Qualification process

2 schools shall progress through to National Finals following this Regional qualifying event.

● First aid

There will be a First Aider based in the First Aid tent throughout the day, though please do bring your own first aid kits to the court side for each game.

● Changing facilities

Changing facilities are available in the Sports Hall and will be clearly signposted. Each team shall be given a designated inside area that they can use as an indoor base should they wish to. Please note, visiting and Marist students will have access to the Sports Hall and visiting adult toilets will be clearly signposted.


● Refreshments



RULES AND REGULATIONS

Competition rules

The U11 netball championships are conducted under the International Netball Federation rules and regulations, including their ruling on gender splits within tournaments. Netball is played in accordance with EN and/or INF rules and regulations is to be single sex. Please read the rules and regulations in full before entering the event.

Please visit the England Netball website for the full rules.

- This is a 7-a-side tournament.
- There are no mandatory rotations in the tournament.
- Playing squads should comprise of a minimum 7 players and maximum 10 players.
- Posts will be set at 10 foot.
- Games will be played with a size 5 netball.
- Players should toss before the game to determine first centre pass and ends.

Timings:

- Games are 7 minutes each way.
- 2 minutes half time.
- 4 minutes between games.

IAPS Netball Tournaments – U11, U12 & U13

Tactical change rule – clarification for schools

Request for a tactical change

- Each team may request **one (1) tactical change per game**.
- The request must be made **via the umpire**.

What counts as a tactical change

A tactical change may include:

- **Substitution:** swapping an on-court player with a substitute player.
- **Positional change:** changing players' on-court positions.

How to request a tactical change

Coach/teacher positioning

- Teachers/coaches should be positioned **on the goal line near their defensive end** at the start of play.

Communication process

- From this position, the teacher/coach may communicate with the **GK/GS**, who should then **inform the umpire** of the tactical change being requested.

Timing requirements

- The umpire must be informed of the tactical change **before the Centre Pass (C-Pass)**.
- Tactical changes may **only** be made **before a C-Pass**.

Speed of change

- Changes must be made **quickly** to avoid delay.
- Please ensure any substitutes are **ready to enter immediately**, with **bibs on and prepared to take the court**.

Umpire oversight

An umpire may refuse a tactical change if:

- The request is considered **frivolous**, or
- The request is made at a time that would **disrupt or delay play**.

IAPS Netball Championships

Scoring

- 5 points for a win
- 3 points for a draw
- 1 point for scoring 50% or more of the winning team's score.

Pool stage

- The group order will be decided by the number of points scored by each team. In the event of a tie on points, the following will decide final placings:
 1. Goal difference*
 2. Total goals scored.
 3. Result between the two teams

*Goal difference is calculated as the number of goals scored in all league matches minus the number of goals conceded.

- e.g. - Team 1 – 15 goals for – 5 goals against = +10 (this team wins)
- Team 2 – 19 goal for – 10 goals against = +9

Knockout stage

- In the event of a draw in the knockout stages, the winner will be decided by:
 1. 5 minutes of extra time.
There will be a 2-minute interval after full time before starting the extra time.
 2. A period of "Golden Goal". The first team to score a goal wins the match. The match does not stop after the 5 minutes, but the umpires communicate loudly and clearly that the match has now moved into golden goal.

Injury and accidents

- Play may be stopped if the Umpire deems it necessary due to the injury or illness of a competitor.
- Great care should be taken in moving an injured competitor or ill competitor from the court.
- Should the Primary Care Person/Umpire feel that an injury is critical (e.g, head, neck or back) and that the injured competitor should not be moved without assistance from Medical Staff, the umpires and schools should note
