## Sport at Merchant Taylors' School

Sport is integral to life at Taylors', with a 'sport for all' ethos encouraging every pupil to participate and develop valuable life skills. The programme promotes athletic growth and an active, healthy lifestyle. In addition to the core sports of hockey, rugby, and cricket, the School offers over 20 other sports, helping pupils find their sporting passion. Pupils have two games sessions weekly, with extra training for A Teams and Performance Pathway students alongside weekly Core PE lessons. Teamwork and competitive sports are emphasized through matches and inter-House competitions. Elite athletes receive personalised support, with many selected for regional and national teams, and some securing professional contracts. Partnerships with professional clubs, including Middlesex Cricket Club, enhance sporting opportunities.

The School's impressive sporting infrastructure includes 60 acres of playing fields, a new world-class five-lane indoor cricket centre, cricket nets, eleven cricket squares, a heated indoor pool, a large indoor sports hall, three floodlit all-weather hockey pitches, a brand new athletic development centre, lakes for sailing and windsurfing, floodlit hard tennis courts, squash courts and an athletics track.

# Code of Conduct for spectators

Where permitted, we are delighted to welcome spectators to attend IAPS events. As a spectator/parent you have a responsibility to:

- Be a positive role model and lead by example. Children are involved in sport for their enjoyment and without undue spectator pressure.
- Be friendly and respectful to the opposition.
- Encourage children to play by the rules and respect the officials.
- Teach children that effort and teamwork are as important as victory so that the result of each game is accepted without undue disappointment.
- Always respect the officials and their decisions. Video evidence will not be accepted in any cases to dispute decisions.
- Turn defeat into victory by helping children work towards skill improvement and a positive sporting attitude.
- Always respect the coaches and their decisions. They give their time, energy and experience to coach the children.
- Be aware that IAPS events have comprehensive safeguarding policies and procedures, available on our website:

- Refrain from any form of bad language or poor behaviour towards players, officials and fellow spectators.
- Try to relax and enjoy the event!

IAPS wants all competitions to run without any negative incidents. Excitement and emotions can run high at events, not least amongst the supporters. Unpleasant and inappropriate behaviour is very rarelyseen but you should be aware that IAPS retains the right to ask you to leave the event if you fail to comply with the code of conduct.

### Safeguarding

IAPS believes that the welfare and wellbeing of all children(young people under the age of 18) and adults at risk attending an IAPS event is of the highest concern. All such persons have the right to safety and protection and any suspicions, concerns or allegations of harm will be taken seriously and will be dealt with swiftly and appropriately.

IAPS expects all adults who are engaged with the delivery of sports events to fully comply with safeguarding procedures as laid out in the IAPS Safeguarding Policy and Procedures, and the KCSiE document (these are available on our website: sport.iaps.uk/safeguarding).

# Festival Rules + Regulations

- All matches are 8 minutes each way with a 2 minute half time period.
- All matches will be centrally timed.
- For every minute a team is late to a match, a goal will be awarded to the opposition. After 6 minutes the match will be forfeited.
- All players must play in the tournament.

#### **Pool Stages**

The pool ranking will be decided by the number of points scored by each team:

- 3 points for a win
- 1 for a draw
- 0 points for a loss

In the event of a tie on points, the following will decide final pool placings:

- 1. Goal difference
- 2. Goals scored
- 3. Winner of head-to-head match between the tied teams
- 4. Barrage of 3 shuffles (3 players selected from the squad)
- 5. Sudden death shuffles

#### **Knockout Stages**

In the event of a draw at full time, the winner will be decided by:

- 1. Barrage of 3 shuffles (3 players selected from the squad)
- 2. Sudden death shuffles
