

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SAFEGUARDING

IAPS believes that the welfare and wellbeing of all children (young people under the age of 18) and adults at risk attending an IAPS event is of the highest concern. EVENT INFORMATION

PARKING

All spectators and minibuses may use any available space in the ISSC car park. We ask large coaches to use the coach bay behind the sports hall, where possible.

LATE ARRIVALS

Should a team be late arriving, or late onto the court for the start of their game, the team will forfeit the game automatically and the score will be noted as a 10-0 loss.

TOURNAMENT SCHEDULE

All courts will be available for warm ups between 9am and 9.30am, with matches starting promptly at 9.30am. There will be a briefing for all team managers/ coaches at 9.15am at courtside near the table.

UMPIRES

Each team will need to bring a competent umpire- IAPS netball umpiring expectations: We expect all umpires to read the IAPS Netball Umpiring Expectations document (available from IAPS) before umpiring at an IAPS netball competition.

QUALIFICATION PROCESS

3 teams will qualify for the finals which will be held on Tuesday 19 March at Millfield Senior School.

FIRST AID

Schools should provide their own basic First Aid for court side including ice packs, plasters and other essentials. Serious injuries will be handled by a qualified First Aider at the venue.

CHANGING FACILITIES

We have changing facilities available. However, we would encourage you to come ready to play and with lots of layers in case of bad weather.

REFRESHMENTS

The cafe will be open upstairs in the sports centre serving hot and cold drinks and snacks. Snacks will be available free of charge for players in the lounge upstairs.

MERCHANDISE

IAPS are delighted to have Team Elite as our official merchandisers, to sell branded products both online and at events throughout the year. All commission made from merchandise is directly put back into running the sports programme. Merchandise can be bought online or at several IAPS sport events.

RESULTS

Results for team events will be published live using SOCS. Results for individual sports events will not be available live but will be published on our website as soon as possible after the event.

Please note all results are now published in the member area of our website which is only accessible to school staff. Parents should request any information from the school.

PHOTOGRAPHY ADVICE

There is no professional photography at IAPS Sport events, however parents and spectators can take their own pictures. There is no law against taking photos at public events for personal use, including pictures of other people's children (Ask the Police, 2018). IAPS asks parents and spectators to be cautious when sharing any images on social media

- The 5th and 6th placed teams in each pool will progress to the plate competition.
- The 7th placed team in each pool will progress to the bowl competition.

CODE OF CONDUCT FOR SPECTATORS

Where permitted, we are delighted to welcome spectators to attend IAPS events.

As a spectator/parent at an IAPS sports event, you have a responsibility to:

- 1. Be a positive role model and lead by example. Children are involved in sport for their enjoyment and without undue spectator pressure.
- 2. Encourage children to play by the rules and respect the officials.
- 3. Always respect the officials and their decisions. Video evidence will not be accepted in any cases to dispute decisions.
- 4. Always respect the coaches and their decisions. They give their time, energy and experience to coach the children.
- 5. Refrain from any form of bad language or poor behaviour towards players, officials and fellow spectators.
- 6. Be friendly and respectful to the opposition.
- 7. Teach children that effort and teamwork are as important as victory so that the result of each game is accepted without undue disappointment.
- 8. Turn defeat into victory by helping children work towards skill improvement and a positive sporting attitude.

- 10. Try to relax and enjoy the event!

IAPS wants all competitions to run without any negative incidents. Excitement and emotions can run high at events, not least amongst the supporters. Unpleasant and inappropriate behaviour is very rarely seen but you should be aware that IAPS retains the right to ask you to leave the event if you fail to comply with the code of conduct.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

IAPS netball tournaments are conducted under the International Netball Federation rules and regulations, including their ruling on gender splits within tournaments.

SCORING

- 5 points for a win
- 3 points for a draw
- 1 point for scoring 50% or more of the winning teams score

POOL STAGE

The group order will be decided by the number of points scored by each team. In the event of a tie on points, the following will decide final placings:

- 1. Goal difference*
- 2. Total goals scored
- 3. Result between the two teams

*Goal difference is calculated as the number of goals scored in all league matches minus the number of goals conceded. e.g. Team 1 - 15 goals for - 5 goals against = +10 (this team wins) Team 2 - 19 goal for - 10 goals against = +9

KNOCKOUT STAGE

In the event of a draw in the knockout stages, the winner will be decided by:

- 1. Five minutes of extra time. There will be a 2-minute interval after full time before starting the extra time.
- 2. A period of "Golden Goal". The first team to score a goal wins the match. The match does not stop after the 5 minutes but the umpires communicate loudly and clearly that the match has now moved into golden goal.
