SAFEGUARDING

CODE OF CONDUCT FOR SPECTATORS

Where permitted, we are delighted to welcome spectators to attend IAPS events.

As a **spectator/parent** at an IAPS sports event, you have a responsibility to:

- 1. Be a positive role model and lead by example. Children are involved in sport for their enjoyment and without undue spectator pressure.
- 2. Encourage children to play by the rules and respect the officials and their decisions
- 3. Respect the officials and their decisions at all times. Video evidence from spectators will not be accepted in any cases to dispute decisions.

Respect the coaches and their decisions, they give their time, energy and experience to coach your children.

- 4. Refrain from any form of abuse towards players, officials and fellow spectators.
- 5. Be friendly and respectful to the opposition. Teach children that effort and teamwork are as important as victory so that the result of each game is accepted without undue disappointment.
- 6. Turn defeat into victory by helping children work towards skill improvement and a positive sporting attitude.
- Be aware that IAPS events have comprehensive safeguarding policies and procedures, available on our website: <u>https://iaps.uk/sport/safeguarding.html</u> Relax and enjoy the event.

IAPS wants all competitions to run without any negative incidents. Excitement and emotions can run high at events, not least amongst the supporters. Unpleasant and inappropriate behaviour is very rarely seen but you should be aware that IAPS retains the right to ask you to leave the event, if you fail to comply with the code of conduct.



EVENT INFORMATION

Parking

There is plenty of parking available at the lodge.

Late arrivals

All registration must take place before the briefing of the rules about the competition. Any registrations made after this point will not be allowed to compete on the day.

Tournament schedule

0900 – Arrival 0930 – Briefing 1000 – all age groups commence competition

Qualification process

All pupils are automatically entered into the individual competition. Schools can enter a team into **EITHER** the **WLSS** competition **or** the **IAPS** competition NOT BOTH.

First aid

West London Shooting School will be covering first Aid on the day with all staff qualified and competent.

Changing facilities

No changing facilities will be available on the day apart from school washrooms.

Refreshments

Lunch for competitors and teachers will be provided at 12.10pm prior to the awards presentation. Refreshments are available to purchase throughout the day from the restaurant for parents and spectators.

There is no law against taking photos at public events for personal use, including pictures of other people's children (<u>Ask the Police, 2018</u>). RULES AND REGULATIONS

Ammunition for the day

Any entrant that wishes to bring their own 12 or 20 bore shot guns will be provided with ammunition from WLSS at no additional cost. Please note that any other ammunition type e.g. 28 bore or 410 shot guns will NOT have the ammunition provided and schools should ensure that they bring enough of their own. In addition to this any schools that want to bring their own 28 bore or 410 shot guns must make sure that all ammunition is fibre wad.

All schools/pupils/ parents that wish to bring their own gun on the day of the championships must ensure that both the gun licence and the owner are present as is required by law including any other documentation.

Safety

Please note that each school is responsible for their pupils on the day and unsafe behaviour or inability to follow the instructor's rules can and may result in pupils being ejected from the championships.

Pupils must all demonstrate sufficient independent gun safety awareness on the day.

All competitors should have at least a basic knowledge and understanding of gun safety and some shooting experience prior to the championship.

Pupils who do not display the sufficient safety knowledge prior to the event may be asked not to compete and will not be refunded. There must be a teacher responsible for the competitors at all times, failure to be able to provide a member of staff may mean teams forfeiting the Championships.



Individual awards

All pupils that enter the championships will be automatically entered into the individual award competition.

Team awards

For the team awards, schools have the choice of entering one of two team competitions and scoring systems - either the IAPS Team competition or the WLSS Team competition (not both).

IAPS team award

- Teams are made up of between 1-6 competitors.
- Scores will NOT be averaged, simply totalled.
- Teams of less than 6 shooters (per age group) will NOT have their scores averaged, only totalled to reflect the team score.
- Competitors will not be allowed to shoot twice to replace absent competitors.

WLSS team award

- Teams are made up of between 2-4 competitors.
- Scores will be averaged based on the total number of clays shot and the number of members within the team.
- Competitors will not be allowed to shoot twice to replace absent competitors.

Refusal of entry

Given the serious nature of the sport, schools are responsible for the safety of their pupils throughout the day.

Should a school or pupil not display or adhere to the safety constraints of the club or not meet the minimum expectations of the instructors on the day they may be refused entry to the championships and in serious cases may not be invited back for future years.
