Directions

<u>By train</u>: from King's Cross/London St Pancras International station, on the London Underground take the Victoria Line southbound towards Brixton. Alight at Victoria station and walk south on Wilton Road for 100 metres. Park Plaza Victoria London will be on your left.

<u>By car:</u> from Junction 1 of the M4, take the A4 signposted Central London. After 3 miles, turn right onto the A3220 signposted Central London (Westminster), Battersea. After 1.3 miles, continue forward onto the A3212 for Central London, Victoria, Vauxhall. Head west towards The Mall, exit the roundabout onto Whitehall/A3212, turn right onto Great Peter Street. At the roundabout, continue straight onto Greycoat Place /B323. At the roundabout, take the 1st exit onto Rochester Row/B324 and then turn right onto Vauxhall Bridge Road/A202. Park Plaza Victoria London will be on the right.

Session Descriptions

Kathryn Gorman – **Let's be honest**

In a time of volatility, expectation and ever-shifting priorities, leadership in independent Prep schools can feel both energising and exhausting. This opening session invites a moment of collective honesty: about the world we are leading in, the complexities we navigate daily and the quiet pressures that rarely make it into strategic plans.

Through reflection, real world insight and a hopeful but grounded lens, Kathryn Gorman, Founding Director of Clarion Education Ltd, will explore how senior leaders can stay calm amidst the noise - and why there are still plenty of reasons to be optimistic. This isn't about sugar-coating reality; it's about naming what is hard, reconnecting with purpose and preparing to consider practical strategies to lead with integrity, clarity and hope.

Liz Robinson - Pants on the outside Leadership

This session will invite reflections on how we 'show up' as leaders in schools. It will explore senior leaders' relationship to vulnerability and the need to always 'have the answers'. Delegates will explore the idea of being more open about their challenges and how this can balance with giving a sense of confidence in their leadership and making others feel safe. Liz will share some of her own experiences and invite delegates to share their own reflections.

Liz will provoke delegates to 'ask bigger questions' about what school could, might or should be. This will encourage deep thought about some of the fundamental questions about the why, what and how they 'do' school, challenging assumptions.

Moving beyond the superhero archetype of leadership, Liz will both model and invite reflections about how senior leaders show up in their roles and how to bring their authentic identity to work with them, including exploring the mental model that everyone has to be 'ok' all the time. This will be a thought-provoking and personal session intended to disrupt some thinking and hopefully inspire further thought and action.



Rachel McGill - Who are you?

During this interactive session Rachel will facilitate an exploration of the four Resilient Leaders Elements so that participants understand their strengths and areas for development in the context of Resilient Leadership.

As a result, participants will be able to describe who they are and what they do in the context of resilient leadership, understand their strengths and areas for development, and have increased confidence in 'who they are' in the context of resilient leadership.

Following the session, delegates will continue to have access to Rachel's Resilient Leadership Development Programme[™] for two weeks, giving them an opportunity to engage with the development tools and 360-degree feedback assessment contained within it.

Bish Muir - 70 acres at your school, so what?

With increased competition across the independent Prep sector, relying on clichés is no longer enough. This practical session explores how schools can identify their unique selling proposition (USP), embed it within their culture, and communicate it clearly to both internal and external audiences.

Featuring round-table discussions and delegate feedback, the workshop will equip senior leaders with clear, actionable strategies to take back to their schools—helping them articulate what makes their offering distinctive and ensuring it shines in a crowded marketplace.

Leo Dudin – Performance under pressure

Senior leaders in education face pressure, whatever their school context. What helps in the moment, and longer term? What can we do to help ourselves and our teams?

This session draws on Leo's professional experiences of middle and senior leadership in several schools, and on theories and approaches from a range of experts. In addition to learning from successful school



leaders, delegates will explore how leaders in medicine, search and rescue, the military, performance sport and executive coaching survive and thrive under pressure.

Through discussions, delegates will learn the core concepts of pressure management and develop practical ways to stay buoyant and effective in their roles.

Dr Emma Kell - Finding the joy!

In this session we will have the opportunity to reflect on our achievements, connect to our sense of purpose, and feel authentic pride in our achievements alongside our teams.

Topics covered during the session include reflecting on what delegates and their teams have achieved; connecting to their values and moral purpose; perspective and the negativity bias; gratitude and focusing on what makes delegates feel lucky; and the power of humour.
