

916 MFL: Encouraging Modern Language Learners to use Spontaneous Speech

Date: Monday 18 March 2019

Venue: Avonmouth House, 6 Avonmouth Street, London, S1 6NX

This course focuses on the principles of spontaneous talk and will look at some techniques which can be implemented to improve students' ability to speak confidently in the target language. In order for delegates to gain the most from this course, we have split the day into two sessions. In the morning, Dr Hawkes will discuss the theory and research underpinning the principles of spontaneous speech: also known as the five Cs. This will be followed by a session exploring how to focus your planning to incorporate theory into practice, in which the following themes will be discussed: phonics, questions, pictures, routines, pairs and groups.

In the afternoon we will plan a sequence of three lessons, building in opportunities for progressive talk. This will focus on working together to adapt the ideas presented into some helpful lesson plans, followed by the presentation of lesson planning which will lead to some lively and useful discussion on the practicalities of day to day speech.

Audience: This course is suitable for Modern Languages teachers and Subject Leaders. It will be most beneficial for teachers of Years 5-8 (K.S. 2 & 3).

Objectives: This course aims to showcase the latest research on how to develop students' spontaneous speech in the Modern Languages Classroom. You will learn very practical ideas on how to set up different scenarios to encourage Target Language Use in your day to day teaching and how to really embed the skill of unprepared and unrehearsed speech.
