The Learning Power Approach: Teaching Learners to Teach Themselves – Professor Guy Claxton

Traditional good teaching gets good results - but it does so in a way that runs the risk of steering children towards unhealthy attitudes such as dependency, uncritical compliance, extrinsic motivation, and unadventurousness. We can teach them to expect to be spoon-fed and rescued from difficulty, and this ill-prepares them for life beyond school - whatever their grades.
