### GETTING HERE

#### **Walking and cycling**

Oxford is a city of cyclists so why not jump on your bike and cycle up to site! We have plenty of cycle parking and there's a FREE Science Oxford bike seat cover for all cyclists.

#### **Buses**

[PickMeUp](#) is an on-demand ride-sharing minibus service which uses virtual bus stops within a short walkable distance from where you are, if you live within the catchment area. The Science Oxford Centre is on the bus route (ask for the Stansfeld Park stop) and you'll be dropped off near the top of the drive to the site. More information can be found [here](#).

Nearest scheduled service bus stops:

Mason's Road and Titup Hill Drive (5/6 min walk.)

Windmill Road (10 min walk)

Old Road/Girdlestone Road (12 min walk).

Serviced by buses coming in all directions, including Thornhill Park and ride (900); Oxford Airport, Oxford Parkway Train Station, Water Eaton Park & Ride, Summertown and Marston (700); Abingdon, Cumnor, Botley, Oxford Train Station and Oxford city centre (4/4A); Cowley and Temple Cowley (10 or U5).

The Science Oxford Centre is in The Oxford Bus Company's City Zone and Oxford Smart Zone.

#### **Park & Ride**

Thornhill Park & Ride – 900 bus runs every 30 minutes to Windmill Road then either a 15 min or 9 minutes by bike. The Pick Me Up service also covers this location.

Water Eaton Park & Ride – 700 bus runs every 30 minutes to Windmill Road

#### **By Car**

Parking is available on site during evenings and at weekends but is on a first-come, first-serve basis. There is also limited 2-hour (and 3-hour) free parking available on Quarry Road. Where possible we recommend that you walk, cycle or use public transport.
