**Art from the cart: art history and creative project ideas for socially distanced times**

This course will begin with a workshop led by Lizzy Rowe. Lizzy is an Oxford-based art historian and museum guide who teaches Art History or Visual Thinking in primary schools. She will present a variety of famous and not-so famous works of art and talk about how they can be used to kickstart art projects and introduce children to inspirational artists and makers. The aim is to give delegates ideas and provide some time to stop, to look, to think and to enjoy. There will be opportunities during the 45-minute talk to try out some suggestions and to come up with your own. Delegates will be invited to bring an example of a project or piece of work that has worked well during Covid-19 restrictions; encouraging the sharing of ideas and resources as well as giving talking points. Yasmin Flett will lead an open discussion on different strategies for teaching Art during these times including how to display work digitally.

A highly experienced retired ISI reporting inspector will guide delegates through what they need to know to prepare their staff and their schools for inspection. The course will explain the various formats of inspection and associated school documentation. Delegates will improve their understanding of how best to show their school to inspectors, demonstrating the pupils' learning, achievement and personal development and the school's regulatory compliance.

**N10****Drama: creating curriculums and adapting teaching during Covid-19****Date: Thursday 4 February 2021****Course Director: Saphron Smith, IAPS Drama Subject Adviser****Audience: Heads and teachers of drama, music, performing arts, dance, English****Venue: Online – delivered via Zoom**

Does the thought of creating or updating your drama curriculum leave you wondering where to start? Are you struggling to find simple and effective help for KS1 & 2? Would you welcome some ideas for starting points, objectives, outcomes and aims? There are many different approaches and ideas for the above, but how do we make sure we pick the best one for our particular cohort and setting, performance where both pupils and teachers engage and connect with what they are teaching and learning, and can we please all stakeholders? This forum will cover drama curriculum creation and share ideas on adapting curriculums. We begin by sharing some effective ways and ideas to help formulate and create drama curriculums that suit you, your school and your pupils. An example model used for creating a drama curriculum will be shared with delegates, which can be adapted for different settings. This will be followed by a question and answer, general sharing and support session on the same topic. After a short break we will have a general discussion and sharing session on how we are managing drama teaching during the Covid-19 pandemic and look at the ways in which we are dealing with restrictions.

Being a teacher or leader of mathematics means that you have one of the busiest, high-profile roles in a school and that it is of the utmost importance for you to engage with the latest thinking and evidence around effective practices in mathematics education. This conference will enable delegates to engage with research and to hear from mathematics and education experts on a range of issues in mathematics teaching and learning. Tom Sherrington (education consultant, author and former head) will lead on Rosenshine's Principles in Action and Peter Mattock (mathematics teacher of 15 years and author of Visible Maths) will lead on the use of multiple representations and manipulatives to support and develop mathematical understanding. Delegates will leave with a new insight into how to make an impact in the classroom and across the department, as well as an increased network of like-minded maths teachers who will be supporting and learning from one another long after the conference has ended.

Rachel will help delegates consolidate their knowledge of the current political and economic climates which affect their school's marketing needs; help delegates to understand why a marketing strategy is an essential part of the school's wider development plan; develop an understanding of what to include in a marketing strategy. **SEND: mental health and well-being and supporting learners with ADHD**

This year's course will focus on two very current areas of education: mental health and well-being, and supporting learners with ADHD. Half of the day will consider the government guidelines of how we can promote pupil's well-being in school, looking at teacher knowledge and practical resources, and how we can embed this into our classrooms and curriculum. Mental Health First Aiders is very much a current trend, but what about all teachers having that knowledge and the tools to embed into their own classes? We will focus on passing on this information to delegates. The other half of the day will focus on our ever-increasing learners with ADHD, many whom are undiagnosed. This course will outline how best to unlock the potential of learners who are lateral thinkers but have a low level of boredom and require stimulating teaching and learning experiences.
