IAPS Sailing Championships

Booking onto an event

All bookings are made online via the [IAPS website](#).

Only a member of school staff with a school email address can book onto an event.

If your chosen location is fully booked, please join the waiting list. Should a space become available, we will contact you to offer you the space. There is no guarantee we can find schools an event to attend.

Entry eligibility

1. All competitors must attend an IAPS School.
2. Competitors ages is taken from 1st September.
3. Competitors can only participate in one age group throughout the competition. The competition is defined as both qualifying events and the finals.
4. Unless otherwise specified, schools can only enter one team per tournament/championships.
5. Only competitors who are part of the Prep School are eligible to take part. Competitors in Year 7 and Year 8 who are part of the Senior School are not eligible to take part in U12 and U13 events.
6. All schools must bring first aid.

Event information

The Andrew Simpson Sailing Centre, Weymouth, is responsible for the organisation and delivery of the IAPS Sailing Championships. Once entries have been collected by IAPS all information is passed to the centre who will liaise directly with schools.

Age groups and entries

U11 competition - Wednesday 22nd May 2024

U13 competition - Thursday 23rd May 2024

Sailors must have a minimum of RYA Stage 2.

Each school is limited to four boats with two sailors in each boat per day (eight pupils in total).

Race format

Four races are scheduled daily (weather dependent).

A combination of windward-leeward and/or triangle/sausage courses will be sailed.

Boat hire

There are 36 Zest's available for each age group.

The Zest is a versatile dinghy for beginners through to stage 4 sailors. It has an adaptable mast which allows for a jib, the children will doublehand the dinghy. For more information about this dinghy, visit the RS website [here](#).

Event programme

The programme and event day information will be sent to schools approximately two weeks before the event.

Competitor information

School will be asked to provide competitor details directly to the sailing centre. Only essential information is collected in order to be able to organise the event.

All sailors must complete a parent/guardian consent and declaration form.
