Booking onto an event

- All bookings are made online via the [IAPS website](#).
- Only a member of school staff with a school email address can book onto an event.
- If your chosen location is fully booked, please join the waiting list. Should a space become available, we will contact you to offer you the space. There is no guarantee we can find schools an event to attend.

Entry eligibility

- All competitors must attend an IAPS School. Competitors ages is taken from 1st September.
- Competitors can only participate in one age group throughout the competition. The competition is defined as both qualifying events and the finals.
- Unless otherwise specified, schools can only enter one team per tournament/championships.
- Only competitors who are part of the Prep School are eligible to take part.
- Pupils **can only participate in one age group** throughout the competition. The competition is defined as both qualifying events and the finals.
- All schools must bring first aid and additional first aid might be provided.

Festival format

Eight-a-side cricket. Squads of a maximum of 10 players. All festivals will be played following the junior cricket format guidelines set out by the ECB, available to view [here](#).

Umpiring at IAPS events

The umpire must not be a parent, it must be a member of school staff.

Medals and certificates

Qualifiers

- 1st - 3rd place in the cup competition will receive a medal.
- 1st place in plate and bowl competitions will receive a badge.
- 2nd - 3rd place in the plate and bowl competitions will receive a certificate.
